LET'S TALK ABOUT WEB 3.0?

What is Web 3.0?

We are at a point of a new phase of the evolution of the web, we call it Web 3.0. To date, we don't have any official definition for Web 3.0. However, more or less it's like the next evolution phase of the Web, where data would be in a decentralized manner. Many netizens assume that Web 3.0 could be capable of providing a more customized and personal experience. One thing is for sure when Web 3.0 arrives, the internet will become exponentially more integrated into our daily life.

Let's take a step back into earlier versions of the web.

Web 1.0

- · It was the first version of the internet, simply we can call it the static web. · In this version, users could see and consume the information, but users didn't have the privilege to write the data or interact with the available data on the internet.
- · Web 1.0 didn't use any kind of algorithms to customize the data based on the user's search history.

Web 2.0

- The Era of Web 2.0 started in 2004. In fact, this year was a benchmark as the tech giant Facebook (now meta) was launched.
- · Advancement in technologies like JavaScript, HTML fueled up Web 2.0 to the next stage.
- · One of the primary goals of Web 2.0 is also to establish universal network connections.
- Over the past 12-18 years, static pages of Web 1.0 have been replaced by Web 2.0's interactivity, social connectivity and user-generated content.
- · Today Web 2.0 is used in many websites which focuses mainly on user interactivity and collaboration.

Let's look at Web 3.0

- · Web 3.0 is the talk of the town, it could run many smart programs to assist users.
- · Web 3.0 gives a lot of scope to be ubiquity, meaning devices that are connected to the internet will no longer be under the control of a central server unlike Web 2.0.
- In Web 3.0, internet users will have a better experience on the web as computers analyze lots of data like transactions, search history, etc.
- · With Artificial Intelligence(AI) in action, Web 3.0 becomes even stronger by filtering fake product reviews, unwanted data, and fake ratings. AI could also fulfill the goal of serving the appropriate data fastly to the end-users in Web 3.0.

Do we really need Web 3.0?

- Web 3.0 could bring a lot of change in the current Internet as decentralization is one of its primary features.
- Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning are added advantages to Web 3.0 resulting in more customized results which could save a lot of time for users.
- · Web 3.0 has the potential to greatly increase application in new areas and vastly improve user interaction.

Quick facts about Web 3.0

- Decentralization, openness, greater user utility are the foundation pillars of Web 3.0. The design of Web 3.0 will be a Bottom-up Design i.e. Instead of developing an application by a small group of people, applications are developed in full view of everyone to encourage maximum participation.
- · Permissionless systems, decentralization will give users much control over their personal data.

TECHNOLOGY ADVANCEMENTS IN VISUALIZING FOR ENGINEERS

Visualization enables you to comprehend vast amounts of information briefly and in a better way. It helps to understand the data better to measure its impact on the business and communicates the insight visually to internal and external audiences.

One of the samples of visualizing is 3D modeling, which helps in creating products that sell. To be precise, it advantages the manufacturing process and in the advertising of things by reducing the working hours and costs the manufacturers can smoothen out their production and satisfy their customers at the same time.

Pros & Cons of 3D modeling:

3D models are extremely critical in our world today, since they significantly facilitate the development of projects of all kinds, like architecture, film industry, design, animation, 3D printing, and more.

3-D modeling allows the designers and give customers visualizing area requirements, however, additionally improves drawing performance and accuracy.

3D modeling for design permits the designer to see what they would not see when designing in 2D. It gives the designer the ability to physically see how much real estate an object takes from all perspectives. When designing in 2D, the designer needs to create a separate plan and elevation view to see the space requirements of an object. Moreover, with significant investments ongoing for 3D maps applications to be integrated with smartphones, market players, such as Samsung, Nokia, and other OEMs, are entering this market. Online web services providers, such as Amazon Inc. and Microsoft Corp., among others, have also started offering 3D maps on their platforms. For instance, Parrot, a prominent player catering in wireless devices for mobile phones, has positioned its consumer drones for 3D modeling, mapping, and agricultural uses.

Amid the ongoing outbreak of COVID-19 across the world, the healthcare sector is increasingly adopting robots that use 3D mapping and modeling technology. For instance, The Milagrow Humanoid ELF, an India-based robotics company, mentioned testing Ai-powered robots iMap9 and Humanoid ELF in the COVID-19 ward of AIIMS. The iMap9 is a floor disinfecting robot that can navigate and sanitize the floors without any human intervention. It used 3D mapping technology for floor cleaning.

The cons about 3D models are that more and more models and mock-ups are being replaced in actual life. There are instances that it is necessary to touch and feel the model to feel its texture. In contrast, that 3D modeling software is very expensive for most people, so its dissemination has now no longer taken the growth it should.

The reasons why 3D modeling is important before building an element or a Structure are:

- · 3D modeling is an excellent way to showcase your prototype products.
- · 3D modeling is budget friendly and user friendly.
- · 3D model shows the physical properties of a product.
- \cdot 3D models are suitable for multiple usages.
- · 3D models can be used in an advert as it doesn't require physical prototypes.

Different 3D modeling software available in the market:

3D design software is a combination of CAD (Computer-Aided Design) and 3D modeling software. CAD is used while creating industrial objects. Meanwhile, 3D modeling software allows more freedom because the designers needn't work mechanically. It is a technical tool with functionalities in industrial design, mechanical design, architecture and fields like aerospace and defense. MAX, 3DS, FBX and OBJ are the most popular but MAX is proprietary and requires 3D studio MAX to create.







Here is a list of software that assists in building a 3D model are:



This is an online 3D design app that uses a block-building approach to help you create models from a collection of basic forms.

This is a cloud-based 3D CAD program. One of the biggest advantages of this model is that it stores the history of all the changes in the model. It also runs on various platforms and the designers can access their information at any point in AUTODESK FUSION 360 time.





This was one of the first CAD software which was released in the year 1982. Many designers have stated that this software is more suitable for 2D drafting and not very convenient for 3D modeling.

This is a free open-source parametric 3D modeling tool that assists with designing real-life objects of various sizes.





This software is created specifically for educational purposes. This software is equipped in such a way that anyone can later use OpenSCAD, which is a professional CAD software.

Software that is one of the leaders in the market in product designing. The recent version of this software, Creo 5.0 was released in 2018 and has improved features like an upgraded user interface that facilitates better handling.





Maya is an application used to generate 3D assets for use in film, television, game development, and architecture. The software was initially released for the Irix operating system. However, this support was discontinued in August 2006 after the release of version 6.5. Maya was available in both "Complete" and "Unlimited" editions until August 2008, when it was turned into a single suite.

This is a multi-platform software suite that includes CAD, CAM, CAE, and other applications.





This is a parametric feature-based model. This software has various features like design validation tools otherwise called reverse engineering.







Sketchup Make (formerly Sketchup) is a 3D modelling software program that can be used for a variety of drawing and design applications such as architectural, interior design, industrial and product design, landscape architecture, civil and mechanical engineering, theatre, film, and video game development.

Blender is a free and open source 3D modeling programme. Modeling, rigging, animation, simulation, rendering, compositing, and motion tracking are all supported, as well as video editing and game production.



Conclusion

To summarize, the unparalleled Detail and accuracy, the 3D models let teams construct any shape imaginable while retaining production capability and help visions come collectively with relative ease. Technologies that shape the future of 3D modeling are: Al, together with photogrammetry and automated 3D generation. Virtual reality, augmented reality, and mixed reality. The global 3D mapping and modeling market size is expected to grow from USD 3.8 billion in 2020 to USD 7.6 billion by 2025, at a Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) of 15.0% during the forecast period.

Similarly, whenever we talk about the topic of Gender Discrimination most people just talk about how women are not given equal opportunities as men in wages, salaries, jobs, television and film industry, to get higher studies and about relationships. But is that what discrimination is all about? The real discrimination is dowry, divorce, trafficking, proletariat harassment, forced pregnancies and abortions, forcing women to become harlots because it is the curse of a woman's life. It changes her situation, education and training status and promotes mortality because of evil. Let me give you a small example- Imagine two news headlines, "A female artist tweeted about the pay parity issue and gender bias in the film industry" and "A woman walked for three days to her mother's house all the while battling starvation. She was left no option after being baselessly divorced by her husband." Which news flash do you think would intrigue people the most? That's the problem!

Many marginalized people should have more than what they get. But they don't get what they deserve. "From The Red Light Street To Newyork" voices one such marginalized woman's remarkable journey.

Shweta Katti, born and raised in Asia's third-largest red light district- Kamathipura, where people are considered immoral and are treated as filth to the society has managed to rise above the muck, secure a good education for herself. She also received a full scholarship from New York's Bard College, even winning a UN Award for becoming the first girl from an Indian red-light area to study abroad. She was included in Newsweek's 25-under-25 women to watch list in 2013 for her efforts to uplift young marginalised girls.

Born in a poor family, Shweta had to witness some of the worst hardships of life since childhood. For the first 17 years of her life, Shweta lived above a brothel building and suffered from an alcoholic and abusive stepfather. Shweta katti's grandfather ran a brothel, died penniless leaving her grandmother pregnant with her mother. Her mother, vandana, was a devdasi and had an affair with a man whose marriage was arranged. As the daughter of a factory worker, shweta katti spended most of the time with sex workers who were very protective of her. For Shweta they are the most loving, caring and strongest people because getting abused everyday and still being able to carry on with hope was the greatest thing and it inspires a lot.

Many people including her father kept telling her how dark, ugly and dirty she looked, which affected her self-esteem and she started hating herself. It was solely because of the confidence her mother gave her that she dared to continue studies. When she was 12- years-old she was sexually abused by her stepfather and brother in law. She was scared to tell anyone and had no one to speak to. Everyday there was fighting, abuse and beating, but that was her only world.

It was Radha, a sex worker and a neighbour, who one day sat down with shweta and explained to her exactly where she would end up if she did not study and motivated her by telling, "Remember, if you want to get out from here, education is the only chance you have. I don't have options and I don't have choices to make, but now that you have, take advantage of it and get out of this place. make your life and be what you want to be.







When Shweta wanted to get out of that place, it was Kranti, an NGO that empowers the girls to become an agent of social change and supported to continue her education. She started feeling comfortable and safe in an environment where people won't judge her. She had written the TOEFL exam, but her woes did not end here. Because of her background, getting a passport had become almost impossible for her. But she faced it, overcame it and the rest is history.

Shweta katti said "Nothing is impossible. If a girl like me, coming from a marathi medium school, could study in New York and become consul general for a day, every girl can do anything she sets her mind to. Some people will always be there to pull you down but you have to claim your own space". Given an opportunity anyone can do anything from any corner of the world. Everyone has dreams, It's just that they don't have resources and opportunities.

She never imagined that a dark skinned girl, who people called as black bamboo, cow dung, ugly would ever be seen and today people know her face and know who she is.

She never imagined that one day she would be able to speak English and today she was standing before us and speaking to us.

She never imagined who hated herself due to the abuse will today speak to survivors of child sexual abuse about how to protect themselves.


She never imagined that she would ever get past 12th grade and today she is a student at Bard College in New York.

It had been only possible because she started believing in herself and learned to love and accept herself for who she was. She started believing her mother who told her that "Your background is your biggest strength."

Similarly, we see many people daily who are at high peaks and our life is full of praising them, praising them, praising them. When a person sees the capability of others he/she will be shocked, impressed and start appreciating them which creates mistrust within himself/herself by the illusion that he is dull and incapable to perform such things. Then he/she starts to blame his/her mind. As a result, his/her mistrust increases day by day, week by week, month by month, year by year which leads to the deprival of his/her knowledge.

Remember, your success does not depend on your abilities. But your success comes from the right struggle, at the right time, in the right direction.



They are sensitive people who have a stronger urge to connect with people and show interest in learning new things. They develop healing fantasies in their mind which is caused by external suppression of their emotions.


What can you do about it?

The Indian women's team played their first Test match in 1976, against the West Indies. India recorded its first-ever Test win in November 1978 against West Indies under Shanta Rangaswamy's captaincy at the Moin-Ul-Haq stadium in Patna. As part of the International Cricket Council's initiative to develop women's cricket, the Women's Cricket Association of India was merged with the Board of Control for Cricket in India in 2006.
- In the World Cup:
- Women played their first World Cup in the year 1973 where they were restricted in the group stage. They emerged as the runners-up two times in 2005 and 2017.
- Women's Asian Cup: Women of India won the prestigious Asian Cup 6 times in 2004, 2005-6, 2006, 2008, 2012, 2016, and a runner-up in 2018.
- T-20 Women's World Cup: Runners-Up in 2020.
- However there are many women who led the team but, the present ODI and Test captain of the Indian women's cricket team, Mithali Raj is considered as one of the greatest cricketers of the world. Mithali who captained the three formats of the game became the first player to score 7 consecutive half-centuries. She is the first Indian and fifth woman to score 1000 world cup runs. She holds a record of playing the most consecutive Women's ODI's for a team of 109 games. Even Women's Cricket is not encouraged in many parts of the county Mithali Raj turned as the leading run-scorer in the world with 10,454 runs as She went past Charlotte Edward's (England) previous record of 10,273 runs in July 2021.
- She won Arjuna Award in 2003, Padma Shri (the 4th highest civilian award) in 2015, Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna Award (formerly known as Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna Award) in 2021.
- Lastly, I am very happy that the cricket board of India is also concentrating on women's cricket as par with men's cricket. The most exciting Women's World Cup 2022 is a few months away and is hosted by New Zealand. I hope the women make our nation proud by winning the world cup just as the men did in 1983!!!

Are you curious about what X-World is? I am even excited to talk.


By degrees, there is an enormous rise in technology creating the virtual world resulting in the real world. The inventions are in such a great way where the physically disabled people can also equally survive as normal.

RECIPE FRUIT CAKE

INGREDIENTS

3/4 Cup Chopped Dates

1 cup Golden Raisins

1 Cup Dark Raisins

3/4 Cup Chopped Glazed Cherries

1 Cup Chopped Dried Pineapple

3/4 cup dark rum or brandy apple juice or orange juice

if don't want to use alcohol

2 Cups All-Purpose Flour

1 Teaspoon Baking Soda

1/2 Teaspoon Baking Powder

1/2 Teaspoon Salt

1/2 Cup Unsalted Butter room temperature

½ Cup granulated Sugar

1/2 Cup dark brown sugar

1/2 Cup Sour Cream

1 large egg room temperature

1 Tablespoon Lemon Zest

1 Tablespoon Orange zest

2 Tablespoons Finely Diced Crystalized Ginger

½ Cup Chopped nuts Almonds, Walnuts, or pecans



MAKING PROCESS

Soak the dried fruit mixture in dark rum or brandy before 24 hours of baking.

If you prefer the cake to be non-alcoholic, you can use apple juice or orange juice instead. Use enough juice to cover all the dried fruit completely. Cover them with a lid and let them soak overnight, or even for several days.

Now, Preheat the oven to 325° and line a 9×5 loaf pan with parchment paper and set it aside.

In a medium bowl add flour, baking soda, baking powder, salt and whisk them very finely and set it aside.

In the bowl of a mixer, beat some butter, sugar, and brown sugar together on medium-high speed until light and fluffy. Scrape down the bowl and add the sour cream to the mixture prepared. Mix the mixture until fully combined.

Now, Add an egg, lemon zest, and orange zest and mix them into a smooth mixture. Add the dry ingredients to the mixer and mix it until just barely combined.

Add the crystallised ginger, chopped nuts, and soaked dried fruit along with any leftover liquid from the fruit. Fold in by hand until everything is evenly distributed throughout the batter.

Pour the batter into your prepared pan and place it on the middle rack of the oven for baking. Bake the cake for at least $1\frac{1}{2}$ -2 hours. You can check on the cake by poking it with a toothpick. Bake the cake until a toothpick comes out clean from the center of the loaf.





Now, Let the cake cool for about 10-15 minutes before removing it from the pan.

And there you go, our delicious fruit cake is done and ready to serve it.

If you would like to age the cake, soak the cheesecloth in brandy or dark rum and wrap well around the cake. Wrap in plastic wrap and then aluminium foil and store in an airtight container in a dark place. Rewrap the cake in freshly soaked cheesecloth every week until serving. It will keep for months as you continue to age it


The first book in the series deals with the character development of Feyre and the breaking of the curse in true fashion of retelling of "the beauty and the beast".

And the ability to say no?










IT HURTS TO SEE MY COUNTRY BLEED

There's no escaping the fact that discrimination is rife in today's world. At some point in our lives, we've all suffered because of it, and we've all been accused of it, even though we might've done it unknowingly. Can we say that it has been completely eliminated? Following are a few stories illustrating different forms of discrimination. If you think that discrimination is a thing in the past, we cannot wait to change your mind!

There was news about a kid from Auckland who was differently-abled. He moved around in a wheelchair. He was often bullied. The incident that made the news was when the bullies went too far. They pulled the wheelchair from underneath him and sent him toppling onto concrete. They kept kicking him while he lay there defenceless and in pain. They were swearing at him all the while filming themselves doing this. It's nothing short of hell for the boy. Do you still think there's no discrimination anymore?

A woman in Michigan fell into an icy lake. She claimed to be fishing with a friend when she lost her footing. She fell onto the dock and slipped into the ice. She was struggling to stay on top of the water which was below 36 degrees Fahrenheit. Within a couple of minutes, she started feeling numb. She said she couldn't feel her legs. A few fishermen close by witnessed the incident and immediately came to her rescue. They held her up until the police arrived. She was safely rescued after an exhausting 15 minutes. The bodycam footage of the sheriff was later posted on Facebook where the girl was subjected to horrifying comments. She was body-shamed on a social media platform even after safely being rescued. Instead of being happy for a life that was saved, people seemed to be devastated that the life that was saved was in fact fat. Do you still think discrimination has been eliminated from the root?

A news article reported that a Dalit boy's family had been imposed with a fine of Rs. 25,000/-, by some of the villagers, for entering the temple. The family were visiting the temple on the 3-year-old boys' birthday. In contrast, there was a case filed by the social welfare department. The five accused were then arrested. They belong to the upper caste, while the boy belongs to the Dalit community. It was objected to by the temple's priests and other leaders who imposed that the temple should be cleaned because the boy entered it and according to them "infested the temple with impurity". The extent they could go to was unspeakable. They even conducted rituals to "purify" the temple. The police held a peace meeting between the two groups, and the victim's father was reluctant to press charges in the fear of turbulence in the future. Do you still think people live free of the fear of discrimination?



A 35-year-old trans woman in India was dismissed from work for being who she was. She feared dressing like herself and being herself for the hatred she had received because of transphobia. When out of options, she felt helpless. She sought legal aid for euthanasia. Despite knowing that in India, only passive euthanasia is permitted- meaning, you can appeal for it only in reasons of terminal illness- she still did it. She knew it would cause a stir and it did. To this, the government had quickly responded and also provided her with another job. Do you still believe everybody is treated equally and not discriminated against?





In New York, a 65-year-old Asian woman was assaulted by a 45-year-old man. Initially, as she was walking into her apartment, she passed by him and heard him use a slur at her. She ignored him and continued walking into the vestibule of her apartment building as he approached her from behind and began punching her in the head. He hit her in the face multiple times and also stomped her and didn't stop until he knocked her down to the ground. The woman suffered multiple injuries but thankfully her condition was declared stable. The accused was later arrested for attempted murder and assault as a hate crime. Do you still think everybody's safe with discrimination at bay?

These are just a few of the stories. There are so many that go unnoticed. When there are countless stories, why do they go unheard? Why aren't we raising our voices against the injustice we see with our own eyes? Is silence our answer to all these problems?

Discrimination has no regard for age, gender, or caste. It shows no mercy to any of us. We are all the accusers and victims of this adversity. It exists in all shapes, sizes and colours in our society and we must brawl in every way possible to make the world a better place for everyone to live in harmony. This is what people are,



One of the worst comments I have ever received was –"You need to stop wearing those clothes which expose your hands. If you wear that and roam around at night, it will provoke men" said an aunt of mine when I wore a traditional designer blouse and lehenga for a wedding.

I was not the same person again when people around me started to label me as an obese girl. At first, it affected me so much that I blamed myself for eating a lot of food. It turned out that I suffered from a severe hormone imbalance in my body. With health problems came hair fall, skin tanning, acne and academic failures for which I was discriminated too.

For many years I thought the problem lay within me. I tried a lot to change myself by eating foods that I didn't want to. I feared the little carbohydrates I ate so I forced myself to vomit out after eating a burger or sandwich. I lied to everyone that I am doing okay and I have eaten enough while in fact I starved myself and slept hungry. Eventually, nobody appreciates the little effort I put into losing weight but they criticize me by telling me that I am not doing enough to change myself.

As time progressed, I started to realize that being obese is not my fault. I started to embrace the real me, embrace my soul and heart and stopped listening to people who made fun of me. The society suddenly felt like two sides of a coin. It had two mindsets- like the two sides of a road. When we eat a lot they say "You are eating too much so cut it down" and when we eat less they say "You eat too less. Don't turn into a skeleton".

After years of being body-shamed I came to realize a few things. After thorough research, it was found that teenagers from 15-19 years of age face depression due to body shaming. People think that making a body-shaming comment can instill fear and discipline in the kid. They expect them to take body-shaming comments as constructive criticism and change themselves. They would never understand the case from the other's perspective. They never understand that the adolescent years are crucial, happy yet confusing for teenagers. In this era where people are fighting for gender equality and poverty, the teens do expect positivity and motivation from everyone around them which is a reason why they become sensitive when they are body shamed.



It must be remembered that body shaming someone cannot always change them. It instills insecurities which is the worst thing a teen can ever face. Insecurities about their bodies can bring down the self-esteem of teenagers. They can no longer respect themselves and fall into traps of addictions and depression in the worst cases.

ZERO DISCRIMINATION

Discrimination is well known in all societies. It is treating some people unequally that is treating people differently. Discrimination can be unlawful or legal. Legal discrimination is whereby you discriminate against a person for being who he or she is. However, if you treat a person in an unjust manner due to their race, religion, age, nationality ethical background or gender is said to be unlawful. In businesses, for instance, where an employer may decide to mistreat his or her fellow employees for example, in many cases female employees being paid less than a fellow man for doing the same task.

There various types of discrimination One of them is direct discrimination where one person may favour another person more than another person. This could be as a result of gender, race, nationality, and age. The other type of discrimination is indirect discrimination. This is whereby some of the rules set disadvantage certain group of people. For instance, in a business environment, the rules and working conditions tend to favour a certain group of people. A rule that people should be dressed is certain way may disadvantage people from a certain religion. Indirect discrimination in most cases is usually unlawful, Victimization is yet another type of discrimination. Victimization is whereby a member of a certain group treats a member in a less favourable way than the rest because they made a complaint about discrimination. Again, being treated unfairly for other reasons is another type of discrimination. This could be bullying which is not acceptable in any situation in life.

Over the past years, a lot of people have argued against these types of discrimination. Many people have viewed the word discrimination as illegal behaviour whereas in another instance is legal. For example, while recruiting new employees may not be accepted in some business if they have visible tattoos. This type is of discrimination is not only accepted, but also legally. Discrimination is not always a Wrongful Act. There is a positive discrimination which helps people make a decision, for instance, in businesses, it helps the employers know who to hire and who among the employees is not favourable for the job. The difference in treatment is not always negative. This means that not all the negative treatment is considered to be discriminatory. In a company, for instance, discriminating employees due to their age and weight can help the employer judge better an employee's abilities to work. However, discrimination is seen to more prejudice than it is helpful. Despite being helpful to many employees it is an assault on human rights. Discrimination law prohibits the unfair treatment of a certain group of people. Discrimination has many harmful effects on the society when people are treated unfairly due to their race, gender, physical disability and religion. 


LET THE FUTURE BE == ZERO DISCRIMINATION

MARINATION FOR PANEER TIKKA

1.Dry roast and pound cumin seeds, coriander seeds, brown cardamom, green cardamom, cloves, black pepper, star anise and shahi jeera in a mortar and pestle.

2.In a bowl add ginger garlic paste, turmeric powder, red chilli powder, coriander powder, salt, kashmiri chilli powder, refined oil, coriander leaves chopped, mint leaves chopped, lime, dry mango powder, chaat masala, green chilli, whisked curd and hara masala. Mix them all.

FOR GRILLING PANEER TIKKA

1.In a tray spread some paneer cubes, julienne onion, capsicum and tomatoes.

2.Mix the masala in the tray. Marinate the paneer cubes.

3.Skewer the tikkas for roasting.

4. Now keep the marinated paneer tikkas in the fridge for 45 minutes.

5.Then grill the tikkas till cooked.

6.Serve the paneer tikka hot.



PLACEMENT PANORAMA

VANI SAI 180040138



Vachas: Greetings from Vachas. Let us start the interview by knowing about yourself.

Vani Sai: Hi, I am Sai Kiran, an Electronics and Communications Engineering student currently pursuing my final semester. I was trained in PEGA technology and completed my PCSA and PCSSA certifications.

Vachas: Can you elaborate on your journey in securing a job?

Vani Sai: I had chosen to undergo CRT (Campus Recruitment Training) to get into the industry with a bachelor's degree. As only 1% of ECE Students get placed in Core jobs, so for an assured and better placement I joined in PEGA training offered within our university. So, I used to attend training in PEGA, VQR and a little bit of coding as PEGA technology uses a low code approach to build applications.

Then started our campus placement drives and Deloitte was the first company that visited our campus. And unfortunately, I failed in it. Without letting my confidence down, I tried to improve myself and later TCS came to our campus for a placement drive. I tried it. I cleared the written test. Following that, I was interviewed by PEGA. I gave my very best to clear the interview. Finally, I received a job offer with a tagging system called TCS- PEGA. This was my first job offer ever. Then in the same week, Capgemini came to pick a handful of students suitable for the role of the Senior Analyst. I appeared for the drive and cleared the first round which was a written test. The next round was a technical interview round. But I was not eligible as I was already placed in TCS.

After that, TCS had released offer letters to the students who got placed. Through this letter, we came to know that a miscommunication had happened regarding CTC for students placed under TCS-PEGA tagging. Then I was permitted to appear in campus interviews again. This time around, another company, Infosys, came for PEGA certified students. The Infosys interview was like a tug of war between me and the interviewer. Somehow my answers convinced him and I got placed in Infosys.

Later, the Cognizant company visited our campus. I fulfilled all the requirements needed to be eligible for that role. After going through all the interview processes, I cleared all the rounds and they offered me a job. Similarly, after a few days, Wipro visited our campus for a placement drive. I attended the Wipro interview also. Even in the Wipro interview process I attended all the rounds and cleared them and finally, I got a job offer from Wipro too. Even after getting placed in one company, I tried to attend every drive that I was interested in and eligible for. I always treated these interviews as a new learning experience in which I learned a lot.

Vachas: What inspired you to choose this field as your career?

Vani Sai: As mentioned in the above questions, I opted for PEGA for better placement. There is no inspiration behind it. I aim to work for a core company for which I am still chasing.





Vachas: Do you have any prior experience working in your respective industry?

Vani Sai: Yes. I have worked for two internships by the time the placements have started. My first internship is at ECIL as an Embedded system trainee. This was during my first year. My second internship is from NIT Calicut, where I was trained in the VLSI domain. This interview was done in online mode during the lockdown. And after this VLSI happened to be my specialisation in B. Tech. Currently, I am doing my third internship in DRDO as a VLSI Trainee.

Vachas: Many people believe that coding is very crucial in securing a job. What is your take on coding?

Vani Sai: I totally agree with my experience. One should learn a specific programming language preferably Python to get placed with a fruitful job like as a developer or with higher package jobs.

Vachas: Have you worked on any projects in your career?

Vani Sai: Yes, in every internship I did a project and as a part of my academics I have done many Minor projects in my second and third years of my B. Tech. In my 4-1, I worked on memory based FFTs as a major project of my B. Tech.

Vachas: How did you prepare yourself for your interviews?

Vani Sai: Yeah, you will find many basics on the internet for an interview. For me I never panicked for any interview. And I advise others to never be afraid of the interviewer. Because he is there to offer you a job not to keep the offer with him. But the interviews that happen for basic roles are quite easy interviews. Just being confident and being good with your communication can get you jobs for average packages.

Vachas: Do you have any suggestions or tips for students who are preparing for their interviews?

Vani Sai: Get Basics things covered, Be Confident, Express yourself, do not lie, gather the basic information about the respective company, and be technically strong.

While advanced computation mechanisms are dominating the technological paradigm, looming cyber threats are constantly challenging the integrity of the progress we have collectively made over decades of thought and action.

However, to counter the ominous byproducts that took life from our creative forces, saviours are meant to emerge from the inevitable necessity to protect ourselves. They accede to the crucial role of spearheading the war we wage against Cyber Crime and ensure the sphere is free of any malevolent powers that intend to disrupt the harmony that fuels us. Either from the darkest alleys of victimhood or the fierce spirit of righteousness, these warriors hail and strive to affirm that no wrongdoing is strong enough to hurt any shielded and valuable resource, forever instilling faith in mankind.

This is a record of the interview of Mr D. Rahul Shashank, Founder & CEO of Cyber Alert, an ambitious Cyber Security firm focused on Complaint Filing, Location-based Police Service, Cyber Materials and free Cyber Legal Consultancy. He is a student of the College of Law at KL University, currently pursuing the final year of BBA., LLB and has turned an entrepreneur with this game-changing innovation.







Vachas: Congratulations Mr. Rahul! We are extremely proud of your efforts leading to the establishment of Cyber Alert. Is the impact as expected?

Rahul: Thank you. I, along with my team, have worked extremely hard to realize our vision of bringing to life a mobile application that could put the cyber security woes of users to rest. I believe we have succeeded to a large extent in manifesting the idea to create the impact it deserves, but there is a long way to go in terms of scale and reach.

Vachas: We certainly hope the future is filled with success for Cyber Alert. But to elaborate on the vision you mentioned, what purpose have you aimed for the app to satisfy?

Rahul: The prime motive of our application is to play a companion in the daily life of every user who invests trust in our idea. It is to make a resounding statement that they are always in the company of individuals and firms that share their concern regarding cyber threats and are willing to consider it worthy of spending abundant time and resources on enhancing the security measures usually taken. That is when they are convinced that we can successfully outmanoeuvre the growing grasp of cybercrime as a true force, but for that to happen, we have to prove that our claims and desires have merit. This is where we envisioned developing a service for users to rest their worries and find a hub of advanced features that effectively counter the perils brought by the misuse of the technological liberty prevalent in our society.

Vachas: What do you think is the current picture of today's world in terms of cyber security?

Rahul: Today's world is obviously not the safest place to be in, regarding information security and privacy of individuals. Everyday shows us an issue that reminds us to not give in to the mesmerising advancements of technology but keep in mind where we could be heading to. Every step we take towards advancement is also a mile closer to an equal risk of misuse. So one should not be over optimistic about the changes we are going through, but always look at the potential demerits of them. All in all, safety is an unending necessity and precaution an unending responsibility.

Vachas: Nothing else could sum up the situation better. So what features have you implemented in the application to tackle these issues?

Rahul: We have planned to implement a wide array of features that cater to the needs of the users. This application tends to be an active guide that sheds light on the right choice for every user to make in case of crossroads by informing them of the possible decision they can take. Cyber Alert has in possession abundant materials constituting Cyber Laws that would help the users attain a sound understanding of cyber crime, empowering themselves to protect their assets from active threats and attacks. This intent to create awareness among users regarding the troubles down the road is what defines us as a group of responsive individuals. IT Acts 2000, 2008 and 2020 are incorporated in the user material offered through the app with which they can equip themselves with the precise information. But a salient feature is e-Complaint Filing, which is highly unique for an application in this domain. Through this app users can file complaints pertaining to any cyber crime issue they are embroiled in. We provide instant access to this crucial facility online for victims of acts that violate the law without them approaching tedious options of finding ways in person. There is a key feature in the app that detects the location of the nearest Police Station to the user by using GPS in the device, which would be remarkably helpful in case of an inadvertent condition.





Vachas: As you are a student of Law, have you incorporated in this application any feature that aids the users with respect to legal matters in case of crime?

Rahul: Of course. We have made available the game-changing feature of free legal consultation, which I firmly believe is incredibly scarce. This would drastically ease the process of taking up legal action against perpetrators as service providers can be communicated with online through the app for them to start the proceedings. I have extensively researched the possibility of providing this service to the consumers and the team has agreed to the idea of moving forward with the decision.

Vachas: When did you realize that you had to take up this endeavor?

Rahul: During the pandemic, the nation was mercilessly tormented by cybercrimes with countless citizens facing the wrath of this malicious force. For that reason I thought of making a mobile application which helps people in understanding the crime and also how to safeguard oneself from it. I have always aspired to apply the learning I had from my education in a real-time assignment that could be of use for many others.

Vachas: Do you have any personal motivation that propelled this idea forward?

Rahul: Yes indeed. I have been a victim of a major financial cyber crime during the pandemic. After realizing that my account has been affected by fraudulent activity, I relentlessly tried to approach the forces of law. But all my efforts went in vain as I could not manage to obtain justice. This is what strongly motivated me to ensure no one else who is a victim of such a vicious attack is left in the dark with no means to find aid. Distraught and driven, I started looking for services and firms that provided the help to users online. This pursuit led me to forming my own idea of establishing a service that deals with the area of cyber crime and assures users that justice shall always be delivered.

Vachas: Do you offer any learning opportunities for students through this app in the domain of cyber law?

Rahul: We provide internships through this app for enthusiasts to enhance their knowledge in regard to this domain. These are valuable opportunities for students to prove their mettle and become adept at dealing with cybercrime themselves.

Vachas: Who has supported you throughout this journey?

Rahul: My parents are my biggest strength and fulfilling their dream of seeing me successful in my field is what drives me further. I shall always be indebted to my inspiration Dr. K. I. Pavan Kumar, HoD, College of Law, KLEF for his absolute support. This venture is nothing without each and every member involved in building the firm from the first moment and Cyber Alert shall be thankful particularly to Mr. Vinay Are, who had worked day and night to program the application for it to function with finesse.

Vachas: What are your plans for the future of Cyber Alert?

Rahul: We have most recently implemented the additional feature we take the highest pride in. It is to provide security to women by making available to them a customized portal to report crimes for rapid intervention of authorities. This is also accompanied by a feature that is devoted to work for women empowerment by recognizing opportunities for women to shine in. In the near future, we are planning to expand the application with various new components and facilities while broadening our reach in the user community.





Vachas: Have you faced any challenges in bringing the idea to being through a mobile app?

Vinay Are (Chief Technical Officer): Initially when Rahul shared the idea with me, I conducted an elaborate research on various platforms to find if there is any application existing with the same premise. But as there is none, we decided to proceed with our plan of action. I admit it was challenging in the first days to give shape to our ideas on the app. But then the knowledge I have of app development helped me to a great extent in overcoming this hurdle. I implemented the features one by one as we planned to give an ultimate structure to the application with all services. This process has been an immensely memorable one as I had a lot of learning from work and the team.

Vachas: Do you have any message for the readers?

Rahul: I suggest the readers to never abstain from fighting crime of any kind. This primal apprehension is what gives impetus to perpetrators for committing further such acts. Cyber Crime of all else is a fearsome threat clouding the world and this is the time for us to take a strong stand in this war against it. My message for them would be to pursue their ambition wholeheartedly with all the courage that turns into confidence, ultimately leading to their success.

Vachas: Thank you so much for lending us your valuable insights and experiences in breathing life into Cyber Alert. We hope your venture continues fulfilling its true purpose for all the time to come.





There is no typical rapist. People who commit sexual violence come from every economic, ethnic, racial, age, and social group.




