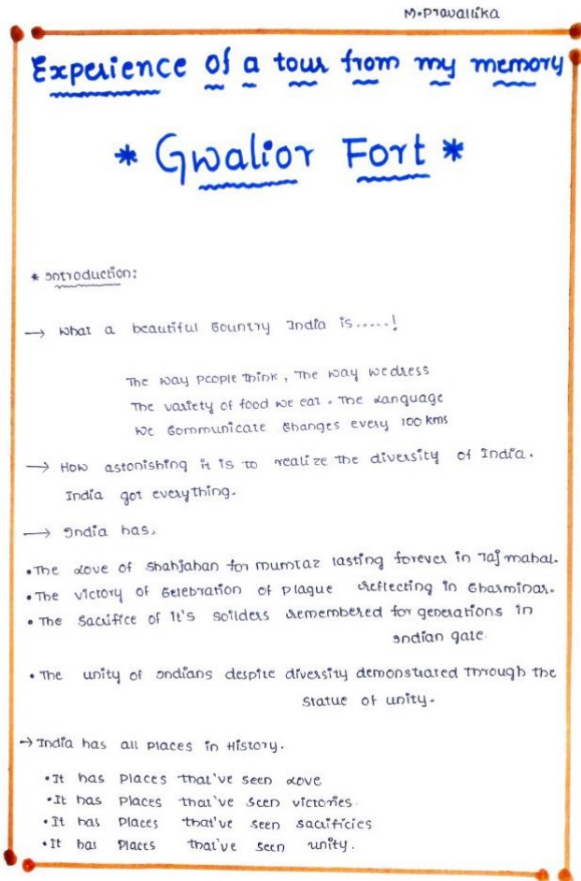

The next day we started off to Shani Shingnapur. We took a car from Shirdi. On the way we saw so many sugarcane juice machines which are operated using cows instead of electricity. We stopped at one of them and drank the juice. Then we reached Shani Shingnapur which is famous throughout India for the temple of Shani. After completing the prayers we returned back to Shirdi for the night stay. The next day morning we again took a car to go to Nashik. We reached Nashik, which is the most beautiful and fascinating place of the whole tour. There we visited total of five temples including the famous Panchavati and Ram Mandir. All these five places are close to each other so that we can walk through all of them. After finishing this we went to Trimbak which is one of the 12 Jyotirling temples. The temple was really big and simply amazing we were all left awestruck after watching it from inside. From there we came back to Nashik and stayed for a night. The next day morning we started off to Ellora caves by taking a car. After reaching Ellora caves it took us 3 hrs to see all the caves and they were simply the best human made structures that we ever saw. Most of the caves are devoted to Buddhism and Hinduism. The best one of all the caves is Kailasha temple which is the largest single stone carved monument in the world. From there we started off to Aurangabad. In the midway we saw some handcrafted saree companies and did some shopping. After reaching Aurangabad we visited Mini Taj Mahal which is so beautiful that it reminded us of the real Taj Mahal. From there we went to Aurangabad Railway station. There we waited for an hour and took our train back to Hyderabad.

Thank God they got us some food with soda, later we knew the food was named as a puff. After teaming up, we started to move on towards Chittoor.

We spent more than 3 hours on the road. Heading Chittoor we saw different temples, architecture, and peoples dressed traditionally. But we didn't get the time and the chance to move out of the bus and explore in detail. The whole thing was very new to us, and we were so tired. Finally, we reached the Sri Venkateswara hostel. Luckily the time was snack time, so we went out for a snack, leaving all our luggage in the rooms that were assigned to us. After getting a bath, we were able to speak to our family that we made it here. Afterward, we went for sleep keeping in mind, starting from the next day there will be a new journey right ahead of us.

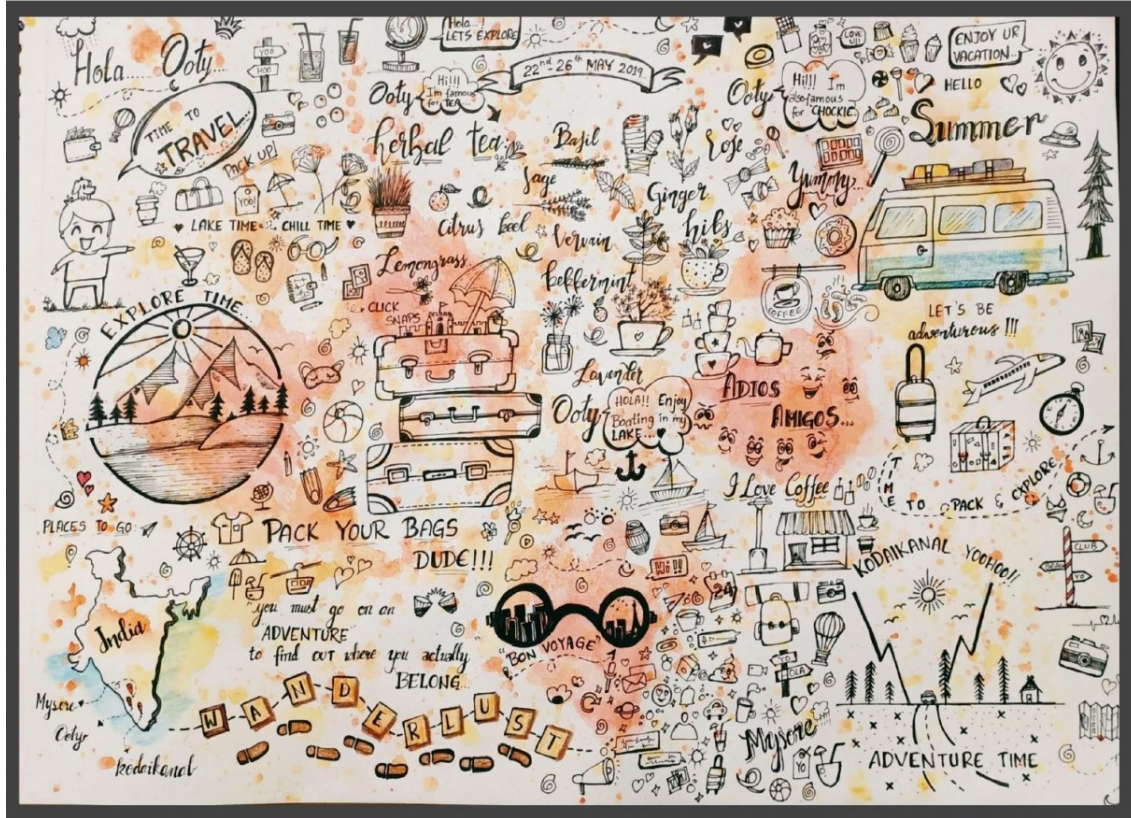

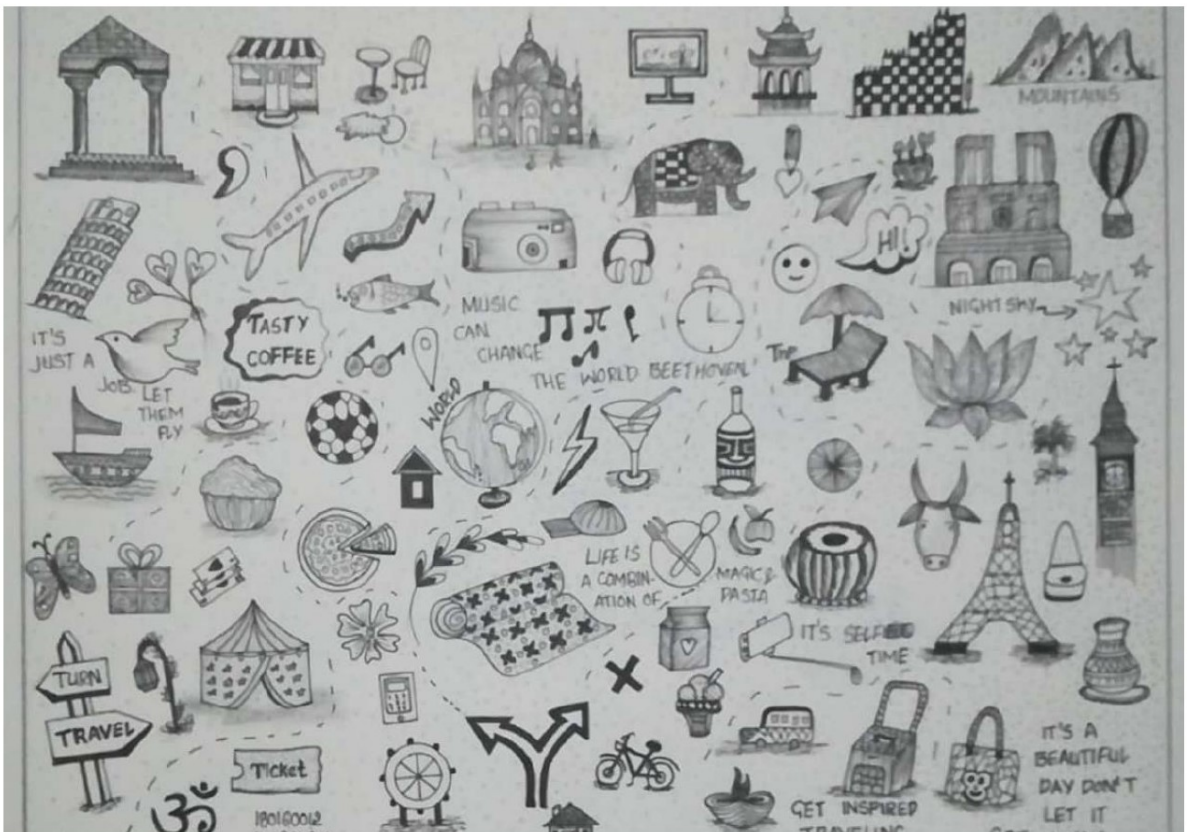

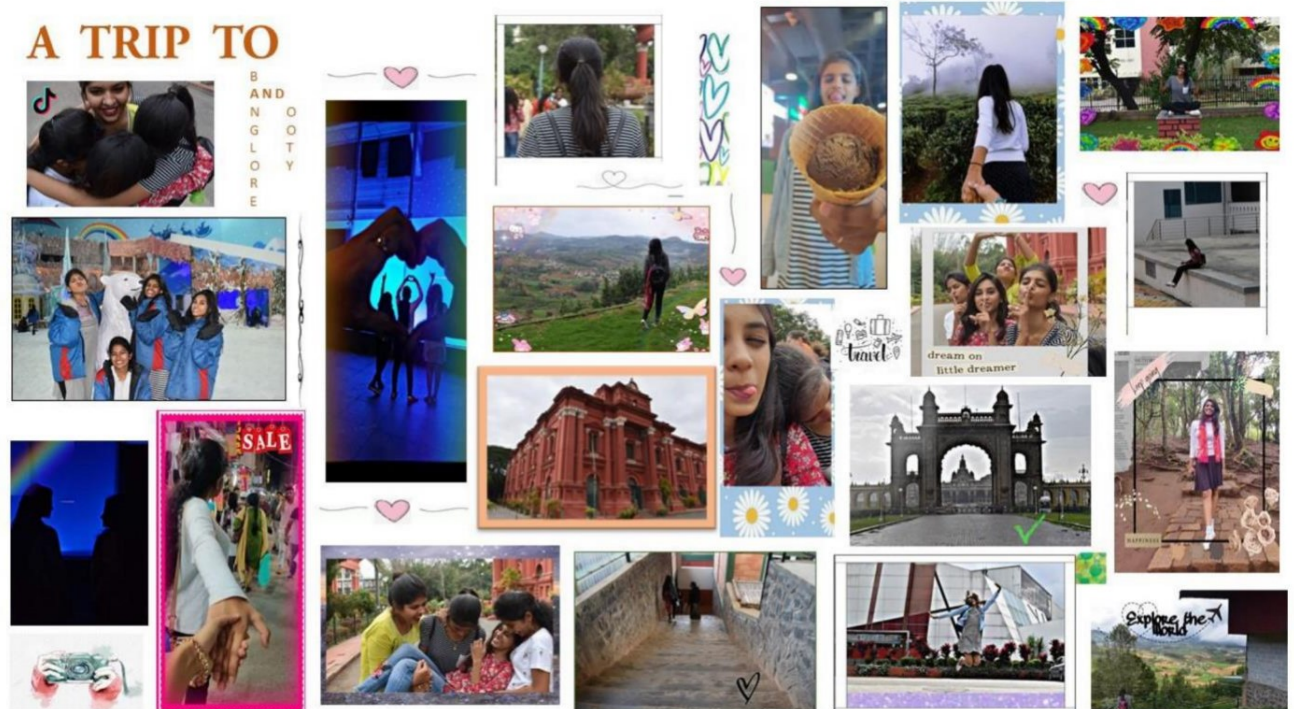
