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A Report on "Blood Grouping" on 07/10/2018 at Davuluripalem <u>Village</u>

Objective

The accurate grouping of blood is very important when it comes to having a blood transfusion. If blood is given to a patient that has a blood type that is incompatible with the blood type of the blood that the patient receives, it can cause intravenous clumping in the patient's blood which can be fatal. The patient's body can start producing antibodies that attack the antigens on the blood cells in the blood that was given to the patient, causing reaction and rejection. The KLEF_CEA team organized an event name blood grouping to collect the blood and make it easier for the donors.

Description

The aim of the event is to make villagers aware of their blood group making it easier to match donors during medical emergencies. Most have not had access to such free blood testing services before while others do not understand the importance of knowing this vital information.

The blood grouping event was a significant and crucial activity that aimed to raise awareness about the importance of knowing one's blood type and promoting blood donation. Through this event, participants learned about the different blood groups (A, B, AB, and O) and their respective Rh factors (positive or negative). The event also emphasized the life-saving impact of blood donations in emergencies, medical procedures, and helping patients with various health conditions.

- By knowing their blood group people could match donors when there are emergencies.
