


Annual Action Plan

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Utilizing the SWOC analysis and strategic directives delineated in the 2023-2028 strategic plan, KLEF University presents its annual action plan. The Vice-Chancellor (VC) will allocate precise targets to various stakeholders and oversee their attainment.

Academic Year 2023-24

Mission 1: Promote Quality Higher Education and Foster Innovation:

Implementation of NCrF and ABC:

Develop detailed guidelines and manuals for implementing the National Credit Framework (NCrF) and Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) across all programs.

Conduct training workshops and seminars for faculty members to familiarize them with the new credit framework and its implications for curriculum design and assessment.

Establish a dedicated support team to assist faculty members in aligning their courses with the NCrF guidelines and ensuring the smooth transition to the new system.

Faculty Development Programs:

Organize faculty development programs focusing on innovative teaching methodologies, including active learning strategies, flipped classrooms, and project-based learning.

Provide support for faculty members to engage in pedagogical research and experimentation, encouraging them to implement innovative teaching practices in their classrooms.

Facilitate collaborations between faculty members from different disciplines to promote interdisciplinary teaching and learning experiences.

Mission 2: Prepare Students for Real-World Success and Global Citizenship:

Industry Collaboration Initiatives:

Assigning industry advisors for various academic departments to provide guidance on curriculum relevance, industry trends, and skill requirements.

Academic Year 2024-25


