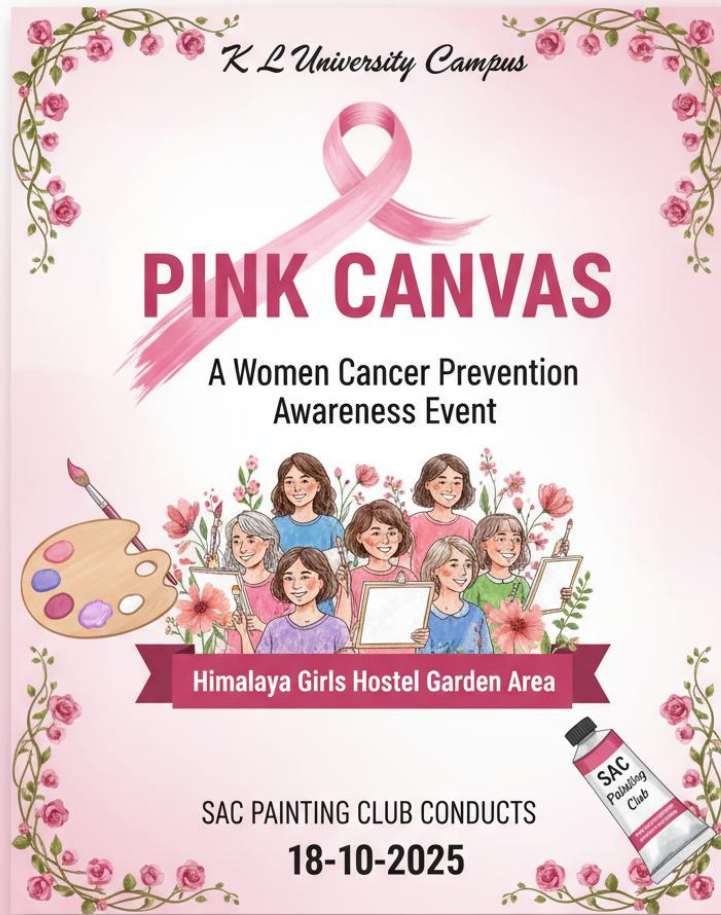

Description

Pink Canvas - A Women Cancer Prevention Awareness Painting Art Event

Date of Event: October 18, 2025 **Time:** 2:00 PM - 5:00 PM **Venue:** Himalaya Girls Hostel Garden Area, K L University Campus **Organizing Body:** SAC Painting Club, Student Activity Centre (SAC)

1. Introduction: The "Pink Canvas" event was a painting art activity organized by the SAC Painting Club with the primary objective of raising awareness about women's cancer prevention. Held in the serene setting of the Himalaya Girls Hostel Garden Area, the event aimed to engage students in a creative outlet while simultaneously fostering a crucial dialogue around health awareness within the K L University community. This initiative was part of the ongoing efforts by the Student Activity Centre to promote social responsibility and holistic well-being among students.

2. To raise awareness about various types of women's cancer and the importance of early prevention.

To encourage open discussion and disseminate information regarding cancer screening, lifestyle choices, and symptoms.

To provide a creative and interactive platform for students to express their understanding and support for cancer prevention.

To foster a sense of community and collective responsibility towards women's health.

To highlight the role of art as a medium for social messaging and advocacy.

3. Event Details and Activities:

The event commenced promptly at 2:00 PM with a welcoming address by a representative of the SAC Painting Club, who introduced the theme "Pink Canvas" and emphasized the significance of cancer prevention awareness.

Awareness Session (2:00 PM - 2:30 PM): A brief, informative session was conducted by a faculty advisor, providing key facts about women's cancer, common myths, preventive measures, and the importance of regular check-ups. Educational pamphlets and infographics were distributed to attendees.

Art Activity - "Expressions of Hope" (2:30 PM - 4:30 PM): Participants were provided with canvases, paints, and brushes. The theme for the painting activity was

"Expressions of Hope and Prevention." Students were encouraged to create artwork that reflected themes of strength, awareness, support, healthy living, and the fight against cancer. The garden area provided a refreshing and inspiring environment for artistic expression. SAC Painting Club members were available to offer guidance and encouragement.

Interactive Discussion and Sharing (4:30 PM - 5:00 PM): Following the painting session, participants were invited to share the stories and messages behind their artwork. This segment facilitated an interactive discussion, allowing students to articulate their thoughts on cancer prevention and support for those affected. The shared experiences and interpretations added a deeply personal and impactful dimension to the event.

Exhibition of Artwork: All completed artworks were displayed temporarily in the garden area, creating a vibrant visual testament to the participants' engagement and commitment to the cause. Plans are underway to exhibit selected artworks at a central location on campus to extend the awareness message.

4. Participation: The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from students residing in the Himalaya Girls Hostel, as well as other students and faculty members from across the university. Approximately 75-80 individuals actively participated in the painting activity and awareness session. The diverse group contributed to a rich exchange of ideas and perspectives.

5. Resources Utilized:

Personnel: SAC Painting Club volunteers, faculty advisors, SAC staff.

Materials: Canvases, acrylic paints, brushes, palettes, easels, disposable aprons, informational pamphlets, registration desk supplies.

Venue: Himalaya Girls Hostel Garden Area (permission secured from hostel authorities).

Publicity: Digital posters (as previously generated), social media announcements, internal university circulars.

6. Outcomes and Impact:

Enhanced Awareness: The event successfully raised awareness regarding women's cancer prevention, evidenced by the active participation in the awareness session and the thoughtful discussions during the sharing segment.

Creative Engagement: Students utilized art as a powerful tool to understand and communicate complex health messages, fostering a deeper connection to the cause.

Community Building: The event created a supportive and collaborative environment, bringing students together for a common, significant cause.

Positive Feedback: Initial feedback from participants indicated a high level of satisfaction with the event's organization, relevance, and impact. Many expressed appreciation for the unique approach to health awareness.

7. Challenges:

Minor logistical adjustments were required due to varying participant numbers.

Ensuring adequate supplies for all participants required careful pre-planning.

8. Recommendations for Future Events:

Consider inviting a medical professional or a survivor to share their experiences, adding a more personal and authoritative voice to the awareness session.

Explore partnerships with local cancer awareness organizations to broaden the reach and impact of future events.

Implement a follow-up mechanism, such as a pledge wall or information kiosks, to sustain the awareness momentum.

Increase the duration of the event slightly to allow for more in-depth artistic creation and discussion.

9. Conclusion: The "Pink Canvas" event was a resounding success, effectively blending artistic expression with a critical health awareness message. The SAC Painting Club's initiative not only provided a platform for creative engagement but also significantly contributed to fostering a more informed and health-conscious student community at K L University. The positive response underscores the importance of such events in promoting well-being and social awareness.
