When a writer breathes life to a piece of writing through words it must speak to the readers. None of this is easy. So, we thank each and every person who has contributed to our magazine.

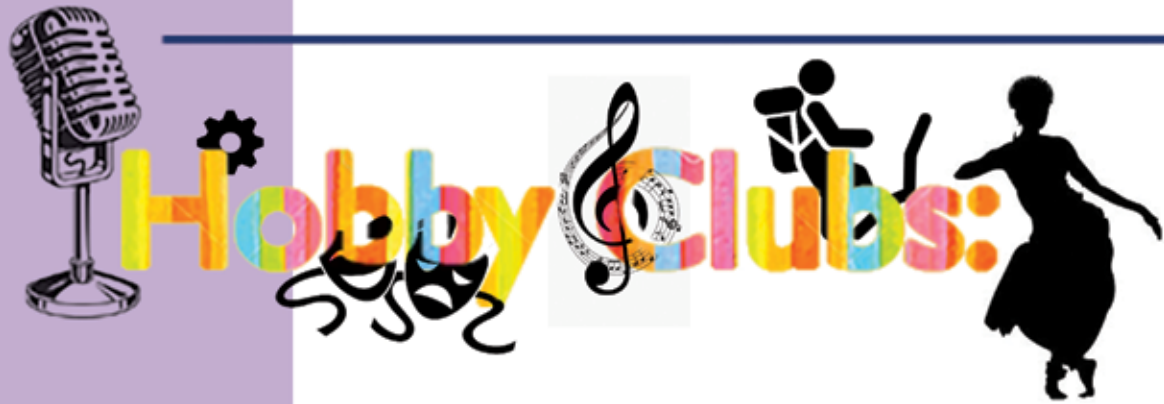

# STORY OF A BLISTERED STATE

On August 5<sup>th</sup>, 2019, Article 370 was scrapped. Article 370 gives some powers to the state of Jammu and Kashmir. For example, they can have dual citizenship (Kashmiri and Indian) and the centre cannot apply any new laws or changes in the existing laws without the ratification (approval) of the J&K's Assembly. But they are Indians too, like you, me and every other Indian, they have the same fundamental rights.

I do not want to get into saying or concluding whether this is good or bad. It is not up to you or me to decide that. It is up to the Kashmiri people to decide what they want. After all, that is what democracy is all about and what is the point of being the world's largest democracy when you can't choose what happens to you and when you are not given the freedom to choose and decide?

To put it bluntly, "The consent of Kashmiri people was NOT taken for a law which directly affects them". It is like the bifurcation of Andhra and Telangana where neither side was consulted and they decided to split the states into union territories with the authority of the centre and they deployed troops in the state. How bizarre is that?

So even if we ignore the legal and constitutional aspects of it, how this was imposed on the people of Kashmir is still horrific. Thousands of troops deployed to Jammu and Kashmir from August 1st to August 5th, in the pretext of a 'terror threat'. The pilgrims of Amarnath were asked to leave immediately because of a 'terror threat'. What kind of people will lie about a terror threat and that too while we are still recovering from the shock of Pulwama? Hang on, the best part is yet to come. Mike Pompeo, the secretary of a state in America was informed about the scrapping of 370 a week before all of this happened. Really?? What kind of government will lie to its own people and inform a foreign state of its sovereign activities? And the way the government did this in Kashmir is really historic. History will never forgive this rash act of authoritarianism.

Phones and the internet were off. The state was under complete lockdown, no advisory or communication to people from the government and the people who are living outside Kashmir were unable to contact their relatives. Prominent political figures like Farooq Abdullah (EX-CM of J&K), Omar Abdullah (EX-CM of J&K), Mehbooba Mufti (EX-CM of J&K) were placed under house arrest. 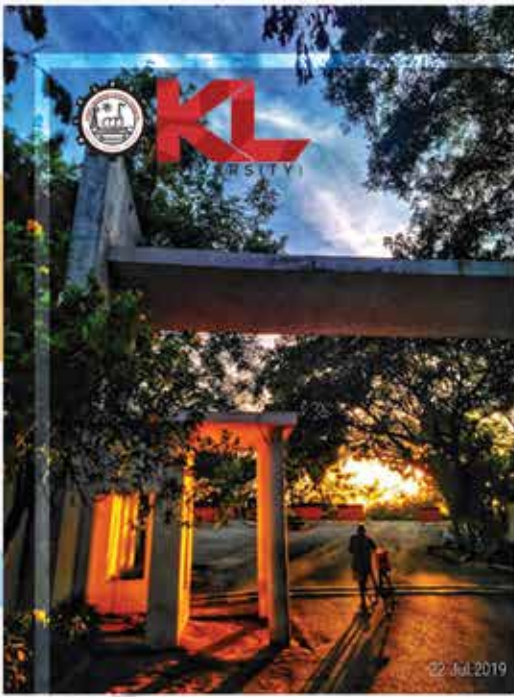
## Quantum Computing and its leash

The advancements in technology mean a transition in the way the things work. Quantum computing is such a field which surpasses our current technology and might even force us to change the way we look at computers. Quantum Computer is not more like a powerful classical computer like a light bulb is not a powerful candle. Classical and Quantum computers differ in the way they think and process. If one must choose one from both the sides of a coin, one would choose either heads or tails, so do Classical computers. But a Quantum computer spins the coin till you ask what it chose, and it chooses both sides unless you ask it for one. Quantum computers are weird but powerful in solving problems theoretically. There are certain problems in various fields of science which cannot be solved by classical computers, sometimes even by the world's biggest supercomputer due to constraints in space and computational speed. The world's largest supercomputer can store more than 40 million GB(Gigabytes) of data or simply 10 million HD(High Definition) movies. This comparison might help one to understand how huge the storage space would be for supercomputers and still run out of space like one running out of space before taking a picture in a 1 TB storage phone. These Quantum computers can store data in combinations and hence contain more space to store, but this doesn't mean these quantum computers are smaller in size for equivalent data storage. Quantum computers are not going to replace classical ones any time soon. But researchers can use them to solve difficult problems and simulations in science fields leading to breakthroughs in other fields too. A lot of research is going on in this field to make the quantum computer a product that is reliable and accurate. Large companies like IBM, Google, NVIDIA, Microsoft, and a few others have developed prototypes and working on quantum computers. But IBM is the only one that has a commercial quantum computer "Q" that would probably be made available to purchase from within a year. Microsoft has developed a domain specific language called Q# to program these Quantum computers. The Quantum computers will help scientific communities to accelerate solving problems including models in machine

learning and artificial intelligence that take an eternity. They will help the advancements in fields of mathematics and computer science prior and all other fields will have its effects in ripples. They are technically so fast that they could break the encryption in current cryptography techniques. This might frighten and threaten the privacy of people and companies that rely on privacy. Also finding the largest prime number that classical computers try to find but end up in space scarcity. Such quantum computers are at least decades far from such applications. Only practical trials with research will help us find the applications and true capabilities of the quantum computer. Companies like IBM, Microsoft, and Google are encouraging new users to access their Quantum computers and try to develop algorithms for such computers. Attempts are being made to create Quantum chips and Quantum circuits that make up the vital part of the Quantum computers. Quantum computing, if reality in the next decade, can offer relief from the stagnation of increased computational power and make Moore's law irrelevant. Quantum computers would neither be existing in your smartphones nor the laptops to relieve you from slower speeds of computation due to their build complexity. But they will be useful in computing your gargantuan tasks through the cloud. Either way technology around us will become faster and efficient. And so, should we be adopting and implementing such mind-boggling technology in our day-to-day life's improving our standards of living.

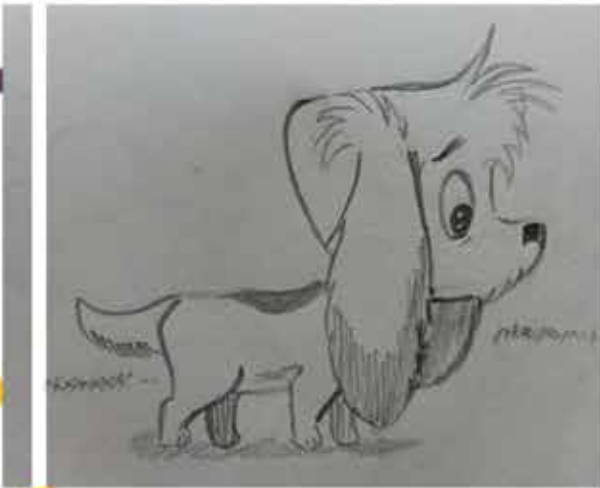

## Recipe: BUTTER CHICKEN BIRYANI

### Ingredients

Tandoori chicken cut into pieces on bone and half-cooked 750 grams  
Cooked rice 3 cups  
Oil 2-3 tablespoons  
Butter ¼ cup  
Green chillies slit 2-3  
Ginger cut into strips 1 inch  
Green cardamoms 3-4  
Onions chopped 3-4 medium  
Ginger-garlic paste 1 tablespoon  
Tomato puree 3 cups  
Red chilli powder 1 teaspoon  
Garam masala powder 1½ teaspoons  
Dried fenugreek leaves (kasoori methi) ½ teaspoon  
Fresh cream 2 tablespoons  
Honey 1 tablespoon  
Fresh coriander leaves chopped 2 tablespoons  
Fresh mint leaves 8-9  
Browned Onions 1 cup

### METHOD :

**Step 1:**  
Heat oil and butter in a non-stick pan. Add green chillies and some of the ginger, mix and sauté for 30 seconds.

**Step 2**  
Add mace and cardamoms, mix and sauté for a minute. Add onions, mix and sauté till golden.

**Step 3**  
Add ginger-garlic paste, mix and sauté for a minute. Add tomato puree and mix well.

**Step 4:**  
Add chilli powder, mix, cover and cook for 8-10 minutes. Add 1 teaspoon garam masala powder, dried fenugreek leaves and salt, mix well and cook for 2-3 minutes.

**Step 5:**  
Strain the mixture into a deep non-stick pan, put on heat and stir. Add chicken pieces and mix well. Add cream and honey and mix well.

**Step 6:**  
Spread half the rice over the chicken, top with some of the remaining ginger, sprinkle 1 tablespoon coriander leaves, mint leaves, remaining garam masala powder and half the browned onions. Spread the remaining rice, sprinkle remaining coriander leaves, remaining ginger, remaining browned onions. Drizzle ghee and screw-pine water, cover and cook on low heat for 15-20 minutes.

**Step 7:**  
Serve hot.

Chinese food is one of the most loved and sought out dishes in India. Be it cool weather or a hot day, many people crave for a bit of sweet and spice. This is where the Honey Chilly Potato comes in. This Chinese Originated Dish is in one of the top-must-try food lists.

### INGREDIENTS:

#### First Coating:

- 2 teaspoon Chilli powder
- 1 teaspoon Garlic Paste
- 1 teaspoon Red Chilli Paste
- 3 tablespoon Corn Flour
- 3 tablespoon All-Purpose Flour
- 2 teaspoon salt

#### Second Coating:

- 3 tablespoon All-Purpose Flour
- 3 tablespoon Corn Flour
- 1/4 teaspoon Black Pepper
- 2-3 tablespoon Water

#### For the Sauce:

- 2 tablespoon Oil
- 1 tablespoon finely chopped Garlic
- 1 teaspoon Red Chilli Flakes
- 3 tablespoon White Sesame Seeds
- 1 teaspoon Vinegar
- 1 teaspoon Soy Sauce
- 2 tablespoon Tomato Ketchup
- 1 1/2 tablespoon Honey
- 1 teaspoon Red Chilli Paste
- 1/4 cup water + 1 teaspoon Corn Flour mixed to make a slurry
- 2 tablespoon chopped Spring Onion (green part only)

### INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Wash potato fingers well in running water and set aside. This removes any extra starch in the potatoes.
2. Mix together cornflour, all-purpose flour, chilli powder, chilli paste and salt. Coat the potato fingers evenly with this flour mix. Heat oil in a wok or karahi and deep fry the potato fingers in batches till the potato is half cooked. It's important that you drop one potato finger at a time into the oil so that they don't stick together (watch video above to see how to do this). Remove the potato fingers on a tissue lined plate and let them cool.
3. For the second coating, make a medium thick batter with all-purpose flour, cornflour and pepper powder by adding just a few tablespoons of water. Dip the half-done fries in this batter and fry again in hot oil till crisp and golden. Drain on a kitchen paper and keep aside.
4. Heat 2 tablespoons oil in another wok, add chopped garlic and stir fry for a few seconds. Add chilli flakes and sesame seeds and saute for another minute to toast them. Now add vinegar, soy sauce, ketchup, honey and the red chilli paste and stir together. Mix cornflour with 1/4 cup water to make a slurry and add this to the honeyvinegar mixture in the wok and stir for a few seconds till it thickens.
5. Add the fried potato fingers and spring onion greens and toss together so that they are coated evenly in the sauce. Switch off the flame and serve immediately garnished with some more sesame seeds and spring onion greens.

## ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE IN PHARMA INDUSTRY

Artificial intelligence (AI) is a flourishing technology which finds application in multiple aspects of life and industry. In Recent times, the pharmaceutical industry discovered novel and innovative ways to use this powerful technology to help solve some of the biggest problems facing pharma today. Artificial intelligence in Pharma refers to the use of automated algorithms to perform tasks which traditionally rely on human intelligence. Over the last five years, the use of artificial intelligence in the pharma and biotech industry has redefined how scientists develop new drugs, tackle the disease, and more.

### AI IN DRUG DISCOVERY:

Drug discovery often takes a long time to test compounds against samples of diseased cells. Finding compounds that are biologically active and are worth investigating further requires even more analysis. To speed up this screening process, Novartis research teams use images from machine learning algorithms to predict which untested compounds might be worth exploring in more details. As computers are far quicker compared to traditional human analysis and laboratory experiments in uncovering new data sets, new and effective drugs can be made available sooner, while also reducing the operational costs associated with the manual investigation of each compound.

Verge is using automated data gathering and analysis to tackle main problems in drug discovery. In other words, they are taking an algorithmic approach to map out hundreds of genes that play complex roles in brain diseases like Alzheimer's, Parkinson's or ALS. Verge's hypothesis is that gathering & analyzing gene data will positively impact the drug discovery phase starting with the preclinical trials. The idea is that the Verge can use AI to monitor the impact that specific drug treatments have on the human brain starting with the preclinical phase. As a result, drug manufacturers can get a better picture early on about the effectiveness of a drug on human cells. More specifically, Verge uses artificial intelligence to keep track of the impact certain therapies on the human brain with a particular focus on the preclinical phase.

### AI TO PREDICT NEW TREATMENTS

### Challenges that pharma companies face while trying to adopt AI

- The unfamiliarity of the technology – for many pharma companies, AI still seems like a “black box” owing to its newness and esoteric nature.
- Lack of proper IT infrastructure – that's because most IT applications and infrastructure currently in use weren't developed or designed with artificial intelligence in mind. Even worse, pharma firms have to spend lots of money to upgrade their IT systems
- Much of the data is in a free text format – that means pharma companies have to go above and beyond to collate and put this data into a form that's able to be analyzed.

# BLOCKCHAIN TECHNOLOGY

## What is Blockchain Technology?

Blockchain is a sort of technology that allows individuals or organizations to make instantaneous transactions among each other. It is decentralized and doesn't have a specific body for verification.

## What is "Blockchain"?

Blockchain can be explained as a set of blocks containing data and are arranged in a particular order. The information recorded and saved would be a timestamp, individuals involved, the amount being transferred, etc. It is a secure system as no record on the system can be altered in any way. Both parties, i.e. the companies or individuals can verify and make transactions. So it maintains a level of transparency.

## How does it work?

1. A transaction is made by creating and digitally signing with a private key using cryptography. Transfer of value takes place between users on the blockchain network. It validates the blockchain through certain rules and information criteria.
2. Those transactions details are spread across the network using flooding protocol for the others on the network to validate the transaction depending on certain criteria.

3. After validation, the transaction is included in the block and spread through the network. Thus, the transaction is confirmed.
4. The transaction block is added to the ledger of blocks and gains its second conformation.
5. This procedure gets repeated every time a new block is created.

## Why does blockchain have all the hype right now?

The first and foremost reason is anonymity. Bitcoin allows users to send money to any place in the world at minimum costs and that in itself is an achievement. The second is stability. Despite the up and down nature of Bitcoin values, it is still relatively more stable than some other currencies in the world which experience hyperinflation. It is one of the most brilliant technologies for a viable digital ledger and Satoshi Nakamoto has done it perfectly. Bitcoin- "The first decentralized digital currency" Bitcoin has come far in a relatively short time. Bitcoin is either virtual currency or reference to the technology. You can make transactions by check, wiring, or cash. While there are people who say that Bitcoin is untenable and you should not invest in it, many happen to think that it is a very viable investment option.

# CUSTARD FILLED SPONGE CAKE

Cakes and desserts are meant to melt in the mouth. This classic twist of sponge cake and custard takes this dessert to another level. The recipe to a perfect ending is now in your hands.

## Ingredients For the cake:

- 2/3 cup butter, room temperature
- 3/4 cup white sugar
- 3 large eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 cups heavy whipping cream
- 15 strawberries, hulled and sliced

## For the custard:

- 2 ( 100gms ) packages instant vanilla pudding
- 2 cups heavy whipping cream
- 1 cup milk

## Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Lightly grease two 9-inch round baking pans and set aside.
2. Prepare your custard: Combine instant vanilla pudding, heavy cream and milk in a medium bowl. Cover with cling wrap or butter paper or dust it with flour after greasing it with butter and refrigerate after you bake your sponge cake.
3. In a separate large mixing bowl, combine cream, butter and white sugar until light and fluffy. Mix in eggs and vanilla.
4. Gently fold in the flour, baking powder, and salt until just incorporated. Divide batter evenly between the three prepared pans.
5. Bake in preheated oven for 18-23 minutes, until lightly golden and springy to touch (a toothpick inserted in centre of the cake should come out clean). Immediately transfer to the freezer for 15-20 minutes until the cake has mostly cooled, then carefully transfer from pans to a wire rack. (Note: the freezer trick, while not necessary, helps retain moisture in the cake layers. You may also allow your cake to cool completely in pans at room temperature before transferring to wire rack.
6. Meanwhile, in a second large mixing bowl, use a hand mixer to whip the heavy whipping cream until stiff peaks form. Set aside.
7. To assemble the cake: Spread 1/2 of your custard evenly on first layer of cake, then layer half of your strawberries on top. Carefully stack on second cake layer and repeat. Stack third cake layer, then frost along top and sides with whipped cream. Garnish with sliced strawberries or other fruit if desired.
8. Slice, serve and enjoy

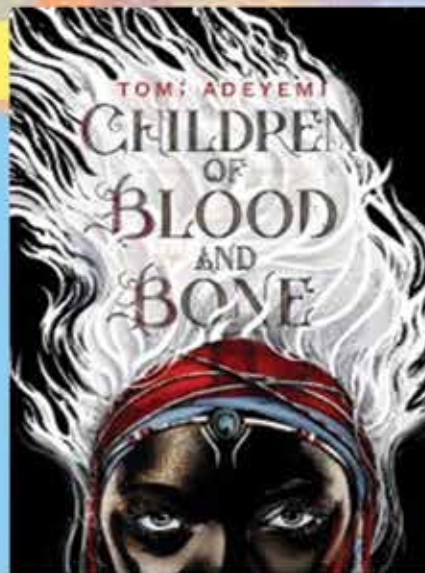

"You crushed us to build your monarchy on the backs of our blood and bone. Your mistake wasn't keeping us alive. It was thinking we'd never fight back!"

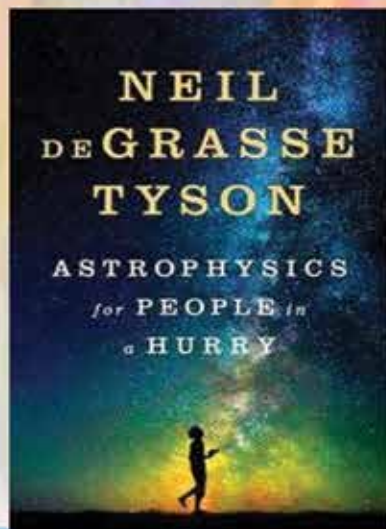

# CAN THESE BONES LIVE?



As sad as it may be, one day everything must come to an end. It is the last mystery of life. It's a question that has crossed everyone's mind because death happens to everyone. Nobody knows what happens after we die, where do we go immediately after death, but in the meantime, we have compiled some interesting facts about it.

After someone dies, the enzymes that were present in their meal begin to eat their body in a process called autolysis and the enzyme is "lysozyme". The cadavers swell up like balloons after death due to the gases and liquids released by autolysis. We are born with over 270 or 300 bones and die with 206. Some people believe that fingernails and hair grow after death but actually a person's fingernails and hair may appear longer because the skin around them has retracted. A few hours after a person dies the joints of the body stiffen and locked in places. This stiffening is called rigor mortis. Rigour Mortis is only temporary. How long it lasts is depends on the temperature. Even after 6 hours of dying, a person's muscles continue to spasm periodically. Livor mortis is skin discolouration after death because the heart is no longer pumping blood, it tends to pool in certain places of the body. A human head remains conscious for around twenty seconds after being decapitated. A body decomposes four times faster in water than on land. In some cases, bodies develop a corpse wax that can preserve the remains for years. When a person dies his sense of hearing is the last to go. Soon after death, a person's eyeballs flatten due to the loss of blood pressure. Between 1 to 9 minutes after death, a person's pupils begin to dilate and cloud over. The cloudy look is from the potassium in the red blood cells breaking down. Because most people die with their eyes open, the process usually occurs fairly quickly, though it can take up to 3 hours in some cases. The Bible definitely tells us that there is life after death. "We are of good courage, I say, and prefer rather be absent from the body and to be at home with the lord" ( 2 Cor. 5:8 ). Here we see that Paul is teaching that to be absent from the body (to be dead) is to be at home with the Lord. This could not be if we ceased to exist after death. It says that there is not only life after death, but eternal life so glorious that "no eyes has seen, no ear has heard, and no mind has imagined what God has prepared for those who love him" ( 1 Corinthians 2:9). The Hindus believe that there is life after death, but that it comes in the form of reincarnation. The most fundamental information about reincarnation is found in Bhagavad-Gita in chapter 17, "And whoever, at the time of death, quits his body, remembering me alone, at once attains my nature. Of this there is no doubt"(Bhagavad-Gita 8.5). Some think that according to the Quran, there is no spirit or soul and that one's life comes to an end at death. Most of them believe that there is life after death, but it is eternal life. Life is a beautiful lie and death is the painful truth at the end. Nothing will stop death. It's still going to happen whether you're prepared or not. Don't think too much about it, enjoy each and every moment of life.

## **Placed in: Wipro, Infosys, Cognizant, Digital bank of Singapore (off-campus)**

### **Vachas: Have you sorted out some companies in the beginning that you wanted to get placed in?**

Teja: Yeah, I have always strived to get placed in DBS Asia. They hire software engineers to flourish their digitalized app. The company was awarded the “World’s Best Digital Bank”. Through my seniors, I got to know about this company, and I have worked very hard to get placed in this company. When I was in college, I have been trained in Wipro Talent Next Program and this made it so easy to crack the Slot I companies. Then, I opted for Infosys training and attended it for four months in my last semester, but I have chosen to join DBS after college.

### **Vachas: What was your approach for the interview? What kinds of preparations were made?**

Teja: First, let me tell you about what kind of interviews I’ve attended. Both the HR and TR rounds for Wipro were conducted through a video call and they were observing every movement and expression of yours to check if I were confident enough. Sometimes they might put you on hold to observe our actions of the call. As I already got trained in Wipro Talent Next Program, I was able to answer the questions. After I got placed in Wipro, I felt confident about myself. But I felt the interview for Infosys a bit difficult because the interviewer was very experienced, and he started asking questions that were highly conceptual and deep, due to which I got confused. I would not have got placed had they not conducted another TR for me. Then I regained my confidence because they gave me another opportunity to crack the TR. Having acquired enough experience in tackling interviews, I wasn’t tensed going for an attempt for Cognizant, and I eventually got placed. The results of these three companies were on the same date, and I got

placed in all the three companies, which made me happy and bolstered my confidence up for the real challenge was yet to come as my goal was to get placed in DBS Asia. I started preparation for DBS Asia a month in advance and attended the online test for recruitment. The next round was a day-long Hackathon in Hyderabad, and I was the only one from our University who attended this Hackathon. I was a little tensed, but our team won the contest, and we were awarded.

A case in point is that we must portray ourselves in a way that makes it convenient for us ultimately. We shouldn't say that we are well-versed in many languages. We have to say in which one we are good at, so the questions can be answered easily. Extra-curricular activities helped me in every interview that I have attended. Vachas helped me a lot by giving me the confidence to talk to people.

**Vachas: What is your suggestion for any student who is tensed about his placement?**

Teja: Being a CSE student, I just want to take this chance to say it in technical terminology. Opportunity is just like a loop. You have many opportunities. When your parameters match properly with the loop's, you will get the right fit if the loop is running. Don't worry, for placement is not the only thing in your career. It is the first step. Competition is so high, and you must run with it. Once my HR stated, "Don't stand in the same position for too long, because people around you will be moving ahead". I say everybody and I follow that "Every opportunity is an accomplishment. If the opportunity comes to you that's already half a victory. You have to attempt it to win it completely." If you don't, you have another one. It's just a phase in every student's life. You must prepare according to the company and work hard for it. That will be beneficial.
