- 4. Comforting people when they need it
- 5. Clear communication skills
- 6. Conflict management and resolution skills
- 7. Constructive feedback (ways people can improve)
- 8. Diplomacy (handling affairs without hostility)
- 9. Empathy for others
- 10. Encouraging and inspiring people to do their best
- 11. Flexibility in thinking and operating style
- 12. Humor and lightheartedness
- 13. Inspiring and motivating others to active greatness
- 14. Mentoring and coaching team members
- 15. Networking and building



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- 16. Nonverbal cues and body language
- 17. Patience when dealing with others
- 18. Public speaking and presentation skills
- 19. Respect for everyone, no matter who they are
- 20. Sensitivity toward the preferences and wishes of others
- 21. Socializing skills
- 22. Being good at team building and at building trust
- 23. Tolerance and respect for team members
