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A report on "Bala Vikasam" 30/01/2024 at Mangalagiri

Objective:

The Bala Vikasam event held on the 30th of January 2024 in Mangalagiri was centered on creating awareness among girls about the concepts of good touch and bad touch. The primary objective was to empower these young individuals with knowledge about personal safety, promote open communication, and address any concerns or problems they might be facing. Additionally, the initiative aimed to foster collaboration with the education system by involving the school headmasters in addressing issues raised during the session.

Description:

The session commenced with an introduction emphasizing the importance of personal safety, particularly for young girls. Trained facilitators, including educators and counselors, conducted interactive discussions to explain the concepts of good touch and bad touch. Visual aids and age-appropriate materials were used to ensure the information was conveyed in a sensitive and comprehensible manner.

The objective was not only to educate the girls about these crucial concepts but also to create a safe space for them to express their concerns and share their experiences. Followingthe awareness session, participants were encouraged to articulate any problems or questions anonymously through a writing activity, allowing them to communicate their thoughts in a confidential manner.

Procedure of the Event:

The session was structured to be engaging and participatory. The facilitators utilized role- playing scenarios and real-life examples to help the girls distinguish between appropriate and inappropriate touches. The interactive nature of the event aimed to make the learning experience more relatable and memorable for the participants.

After the awareness session, the girls were provided with an opportunity to write down any problems or questions they might have encountered in their lives. This anonymous expression allowed them to freely communicate their concerns without fear of judgment or retribution. The facilitators then collected these notes for further analysis and action.

Subsequently, the organizers liaised with the headmasters of the girls' schools to

discuss the concerns raised during the session. This collaborative approach aimed to address issues not only at the awareness level but also in a broader context within the school environment. The involvement of school authorities was crucial in ensuring a comprehensive and sustained impact.

Conclusion:

The Bala Vikasam event on awareness about good touch and bad touch in Mangalagiri concluded with a commitment to ongoing support and collaboration. Certificates of participation were distributed to the girls, and they were reassured that their concerns were heard and steps were being taken to address them.

The event successfully achieved its primary objectives of educating the girls about personal safety, providing a platform for them to express their concerns, and initiating a collaborative effort with the school authorities. The feedback received indicated a positive impact, with participants expressing gratitude for the informative and supportive session.

In conclusion, the Bala Vikasam initiative in Mangalagiri demonstrated a proactive and comprehensive approach to addressing sensitive topics affecting young girls. By combining awareness sessions with a platform for expression and collaboration with school authorities, the organizers have taken significant steps toward ensuring the well-being of the participants.
