Objective:

The objective of creating awareness on environmental hygiene is to educate people about the importance of keeping their surroundings clean and healthy. It aims to reduce the spread of diseases by promoting proper waste management, sanitation, and safe water practices. The program encourages individuals and communities to adopt hygienic habits that protect both personal health and the environment. It also seeks to instill a sense of responsibility towards maintaining cleanliness in public spaces. Ultimately, the goal is to build a healthier, safer, and more sustainable living environment for all.

Description:

Senthil Athithan, Head of the CSE-3 Department, stated that stagnant sewage in drains, discarded coconut shells, tyres, and unused water containers create breeding grounds for mosquitoes, leading to the spread of fevers like Dengue, Malaria, and Chikungunya. People were advised to use mosquito nets, consume hygienic food, and consult doctors if fever persists for more than three days.

The efforts of the NSS volunteers were appreciated by University Vice-Chancellor Dr. G. Pardha Saradhi Varma, Pro Vice-Chancellors Dr. A.V.S. Prasad, Dr. N. Venkataram, Dr. K. They were educated on proper waste disposal methods and the need to prevent water stagnation to avoid mosquito breeding. 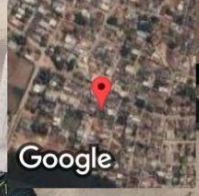

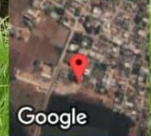

Objective:

The objective of educating girls on Good Touch and Bad Touch is to create awareness about personal safety and boundaries. It helps children identify safe and unsafe behavior and empowers them to speak up when they feel uncomfortable. This education builds confidence and encourages open communication with parents, teachers, or trusted elders. It also reduces the risk of abuse by making children alert and informed. Overall, it aims to ensure a safe, secure, and respectful environment for every girl.

Description:

As part of the Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Abhiyan initiated by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India, the KLEF National Service Scheme (NSS) organized a program on “Educating Girls on Good Touch & Bad Touch” at the High School in Pedavadlapudi village, Mangalagiri Mandal, on Monday through its NSS CSC-2 unit. 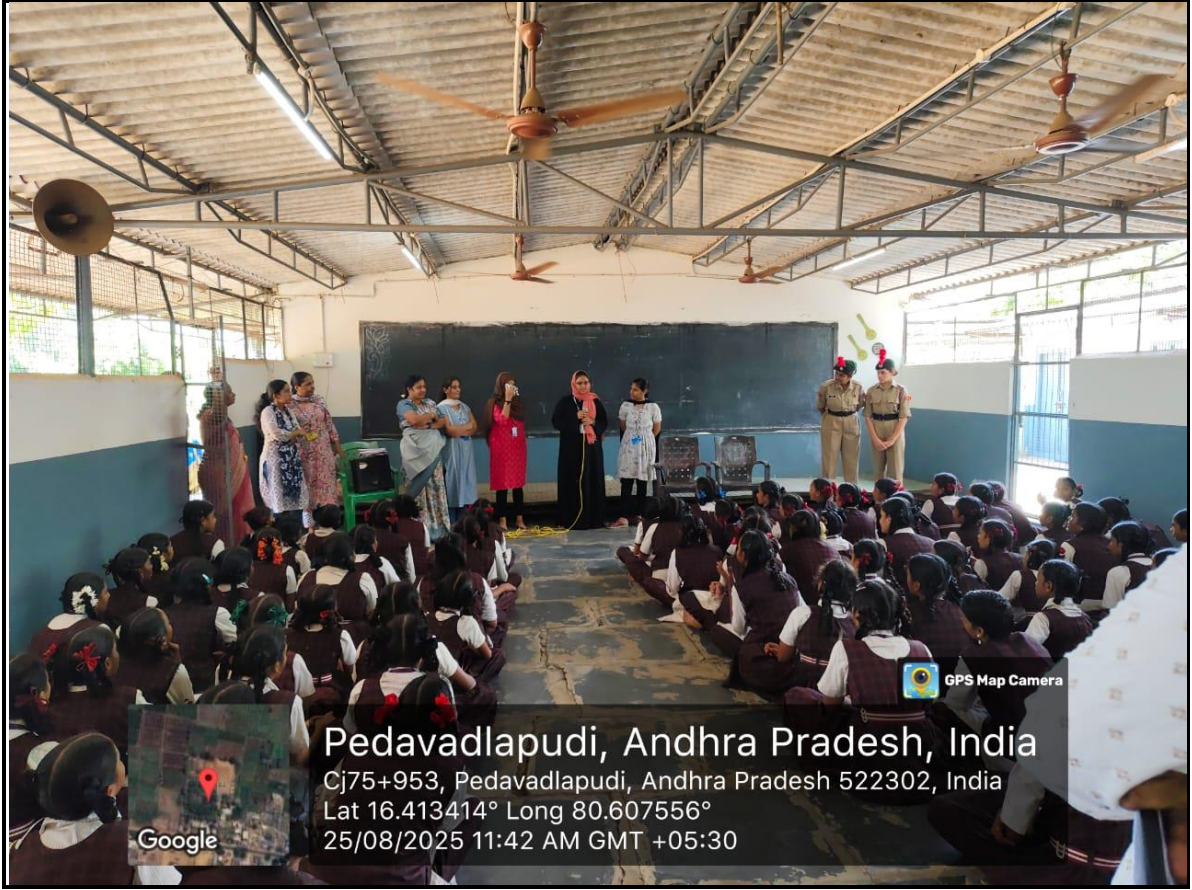

Objective:

The objective of Training the Public on Primary Medical Care on World First Aid Day is to equip individuals with essential knowledge and skills to respond effectively during medical emergencies. It aims to create awareness about basic first aid techniques that can save lives before professional medical help arrives. The program encourages community participation and builds confidence in handling accidents, injuries, or sudden health issues. It also emphasizes the importance of timely intervention to reduce complications and fatalities. Ultimately, it fosters a safer and more prepared society capable of providing immediate care in critical situations.

Description:

Under the directions of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports and the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, the National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of KL University organized a training program on primary medical care for the public on Friday, 19th September 2025 at Revendrapadu village, Duggirala Mandal, conducted by CSE-4 division NSS volunteers, as stated by the Dean of Student Affairs, Dr. K.R.S. Prasad.

He mentioned that in the present times, sudden heart attacks can occur regardless of age, and by providing basic cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) without panic, bystanders can help save lives until the patient reaches a hospital. Similarly, awareness was provided on how to respond if farmers are bitten by snakes while working in the fields, by immobilizing the affected area with a cloth and taking them to the hospital as quickly as possible. The program also covered first aid measures for road accidents, fire accidents, and other emergencies, as well as the essential medical tools and supplies to keep at home, explained NSS Programme Coordinator Dr. P. Sreekanth Reddy.

The program was coordinated by Mr. P. Suresh, and the volunteers were felicitated by University Vice-Chancellor Dr. Pardhasaradhi Varma, Pro Vice-Chancellors Dr. A.V.S. Prasad, Dr. N. Venkatram, Dr. K. Rajashekar Rao, Dean of Student Affairs advisors Dr. Habibullah Khan, and Programme Officer Mr. G. Mohan Rao, among others.



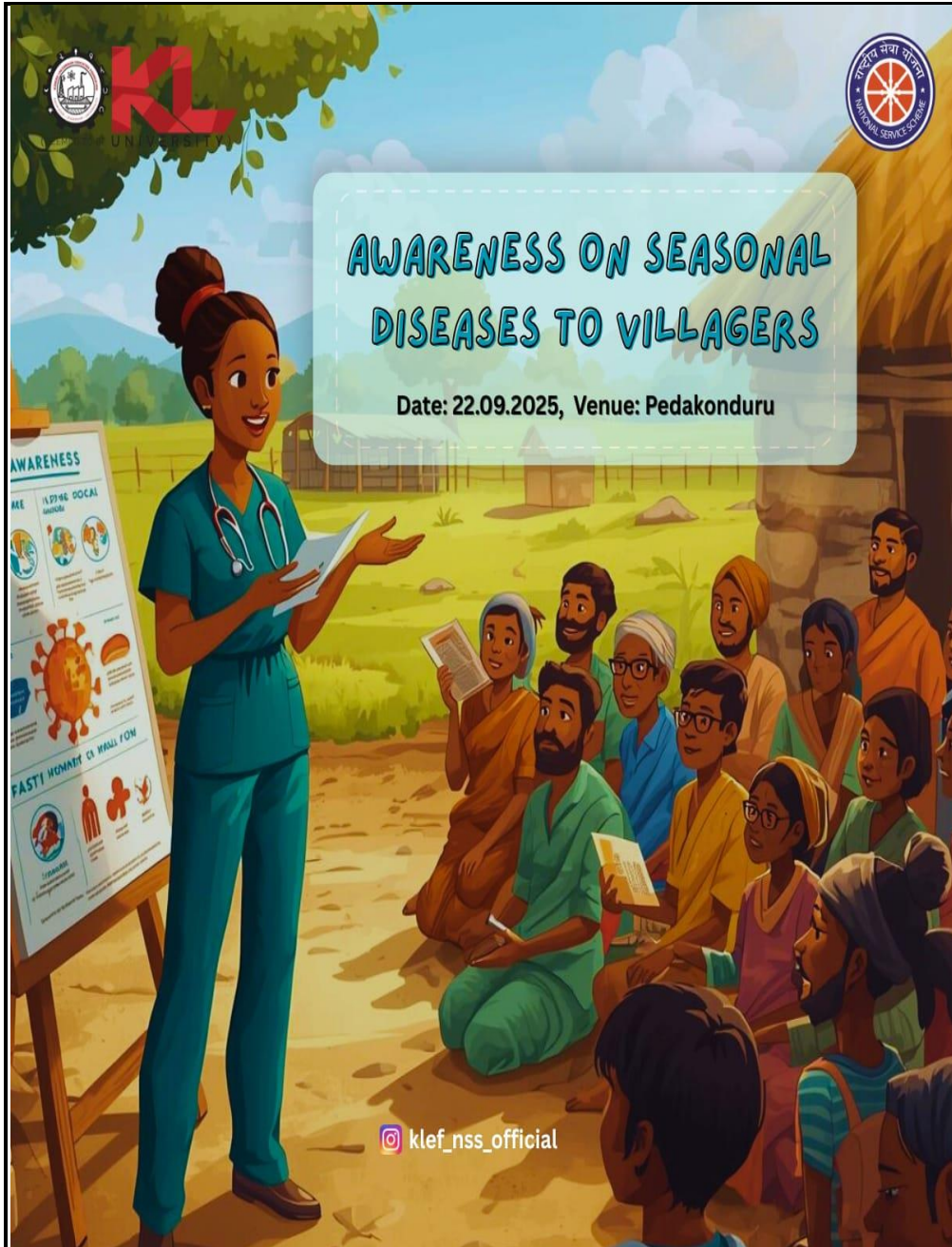

Objective:

The objective of the NSS program on awareness of seasonal diseases is to educate communities about the causes, symptoms, and preventive measures related to illnesses that commonly occur during specific seasons, such as dengue, malaria, chikungunya during the monsoon, heatstroke in summer, and flu in winter. The program aims to promote healthy practices like maintaining personal hygiene, using mosquito repellents, drinking safe water, and ensuring proper sanitation. By organizing activities such as rallies, health camps, poster campaigns, and door-to-door awareness drives, NSS volunteers play a vital role in spreading knowledge and encouraging community participation in disease prevention. Description:

As part of the Nirmal Bharat Abhiyan programme initiated by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India, KL University National Service Scheme (NSS) organized a programme on Monday 22nd September 2025 at Pedakonduru village, Duggirala Mandal. Objective:

The objective of awareness on human rights is to educate people about their fundamental rights and freedoms guaranteed to every individual. It aims to promote equality, dignity, and respect irrespective of caste, gender, religion, or background. Human rights awareness helps individuals recognize and oppose injustice, discrimination, and exploitation. It empowers people to seek legal remedies and protection against violations. The programme encourages active citizenship and responsible participation in a democratic society. Ultimately, it contributes to building a just, inclusive, and peaceful society.

Description:

As per the guidelines of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, National Service Scheme (NSS), Regional Directorate, and State NSS, the NSS Unit of the Department of CSE-4, KL University organized a public awareness programme on Human Rights on Friday, 23rd December 2025, at Verlapalem village in Duggirala Mandal, said Dr. K. Objective:

The objective of creating Awareness on Health issues caused by Pollution is to educate people about the serious health risks associated with polluted Air, Water, Soil, and Noise. It aims to help individuals understand how pollution leads to diseases such as asthma, heart problems, skin disorders, and infections. Another objective is to encourage people to adopt preventive measures and eco-friendly habits in daily life. It also seeks to motivate communities to actively participate in pollution control and environmental protection. Special emphasis is given to safeguarding vulnerable groups like children, the elderly, and pregnant women. Ultimately, the goal is to promote a healthier society and a cleaner, sustainable environment.

Description:

As per the guidelines of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, National Service Scheme (NSS), Regional Directorate of NSS, and State NSS, the NSS Unit of the Department of CSE-2, KL University, organized a public awareness programme on pollution on Tuesday, 23rd December 2025, at Pedapalem village in Duggirala Mandal, said Dr.K.R.S. Prasad, Dean of Student Affairs, KL University. He stated that the programme aimed to educate people about the causes and harmful effects of pollution and to encourage everyone to take personal responsibility in preventing it. NSS Programme Coordinator Mr.P. Srikanth Reddy emphasized that only through collective effort can a pollution-free society be achieved.

The speakers explained that pollution mainly occurs in the form of air, water, soil, and noise pollution. Air pollution is caused by vehicle emissions, harmful gases released from factories and industries, burning of garbage and plastics, dust from construction activities, and forest fires. Water pollution occurs when industrial chemicals and sewage are discharged into rivers, canals, and ponds, when pesticides used in agriculture mix with water, and when plastic waste is dumped into water bodies. Soil pollution results from the excessive use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides, dumping of plastic and solid waste on land, and the mixing of industrial waste with soil. Noise pollution is caused by vehicle horns, loudspeakers, and machinery in factories, construction activities, and bursting of crackers. NSS Programme Officer Dr.Ch.Nagamani stated that these forms of pollution have a severe impact on human health and the environment, making preventive measures essential. He added that NSS volunteers went door to door to create awareness among the villagers.

The programme was coordinated by NSS Field Coordinator Mr.P.Suresh. The volunteers were appreciated and encouraged by Vice-Chancellor Dr. G. Parthasarathi Varma, Pro Vice-Chancellors Dr. A. V. S. Prasad, Dr. N. Venkataram, and Dr. K. Rajashekhara Rao, Dean Advisors Dr. Habibullah Khan, Registrar Dr. K. Subbarao, Principal Dr. V. Rajesh, Associate Dean Dr. Shanta Sri, Dr.B.Tirupati Reddy and others.

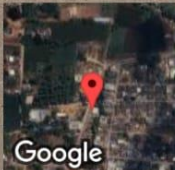

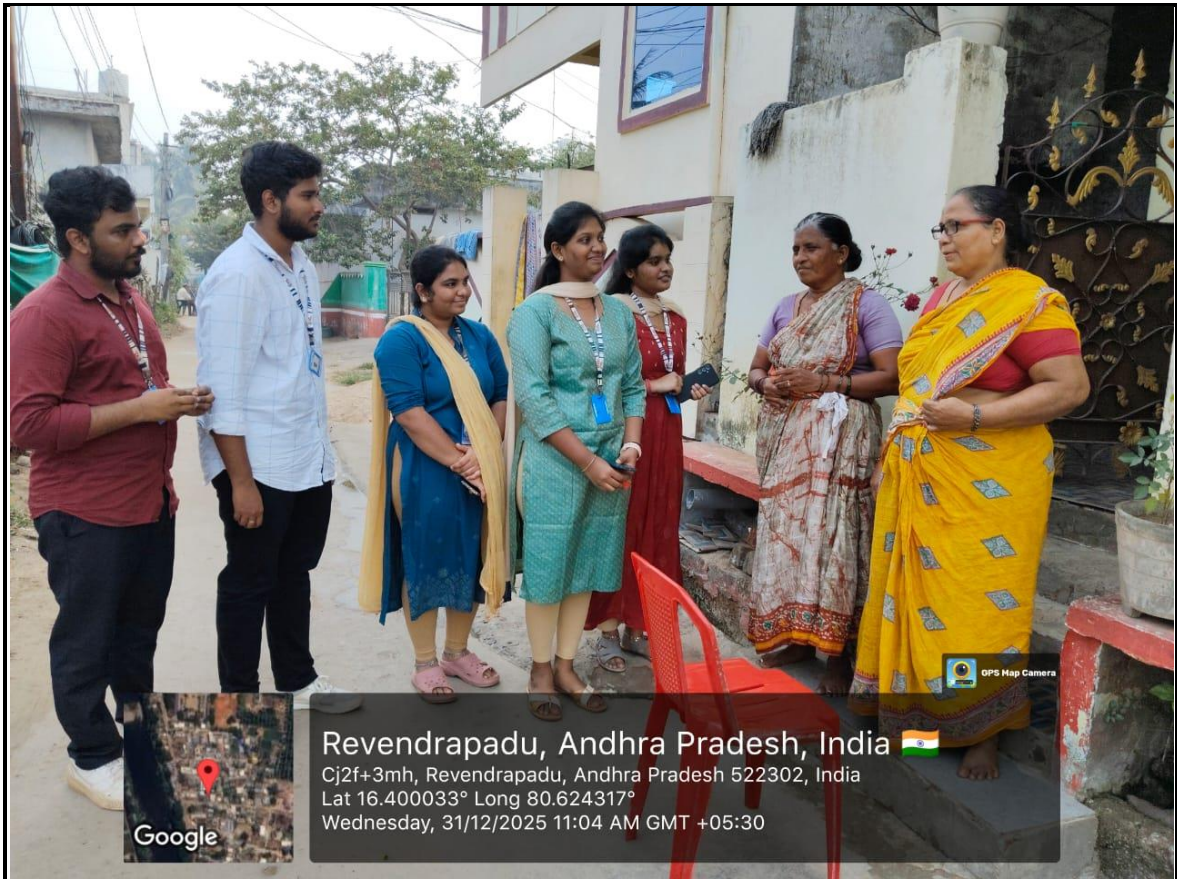
Impact on Society:
