Aim

The Annual Training Camp (ATC–XVII), organized by the 10 Andhra Girls Battalion NCC at KL University, Vaddeswaram, from 03 June 2026 to 12 June 2026, aimed to develop discipline, leadership qualities, self-confidence, teamwork, physical fitness, and a spirit of patriotism among NCC cadets. Through a well-planned schedule of military training, physical activities, competitions, and educational sessions, the camp provided cadets with opportunities to enhance their personality, communication skills, and decision-making abilities while preparing them to become responsible and capable citizens.

The camp also focused on promoting national integration, social responsibility, and overall personality development by engaging cadets in drill training, weapon simulation, disaster management, health awareness programmes, sports, cultural activities, and leadership responsibilities. The ten-day training programme successfully encouraged cadets to strengthen their physical endurance, mental resilience, and organizational skills while fostering unity, cooperation, and the core values of the National Cadet Corps.

Description

The Annual Training Camp (ATC–XVII) was organized by the 10 Andhra Girls Battalion NCC at KL University, Vaddeswaram, from 03 June 2026 to 12 June 2026, with the participation of 410 NCC cadets. The camp was conducted in a disciplined and systematic manner with a well-planned daily schedule. Except on the reporting and closing days, every morning began at 05:00 AM with the Physical Training (PT) Parade, which included warm-up exercises, jogging, stretching, drill practice, relay races, tug of war, obstacle training, yoga, sports activities, and Guard of Honor practice. These activities improved the cadets' physical fitness, stamina, coordination, discipline, and teamwork. After completing the morning training, breakfast was served at 07:30 AM, providing the cadets with sufficient energy for the day's activities.

From 09:00 AM onwards, various training sessions, practical demonstrations, and instructional classes were conducted by the PI Staff, Associate NCC Officers (ANOs), and invited resource persons. The cadets attended classes on NCC subjects, leadership, discipline, personality development, and communication skills. They also participated in Simulator Firing Practice, Tent Pitching, Para Basic Course Selection, Thal Sainik Camp (TSC) Obstacle Training, Guard of Honor Practice, Uniform Inspection, Drill Practice, Dental Health Awareness and Check-up, Fire Mock Drill, and NDRF Practical Training. Refreshments were

served daily at 11:00 AM, followed by the continuation of instructional and practical sessions.

Lunch was served every day at 01:00 PM, after which cadets were given a short rest before resuming the afternoon schedule. Evening refreshments were provided daily at around 04:00 PM, followed by sports, competitions, and special activities. Throughout the camp, cadets enthusiastically participated in Badminton, Throw Ball, Relay Race, Quiz Competition, Elocution Competition, Drill Competition, Cultural Selections, Cultural Practice, and Yoga sessions. These activities helped improve their confidence, communication skills, teamwork, sportsmanship, leadership qualities, and overall personality.

Every evening, cadets assembled for the Roll Call Parade at approximately 07:00 PM, where attendance was taken, important instructions and announcements were given by the Camp Commandant, ANOs, and PI Staff. The parade concluded with the singing of the NCC Song, which promoted discipline, unity, patriotism, and a strong sense of belonging among all cadets. Dinner was served every night between 08:00 PM and 09:00 PM, after which cadets returned to their accommodations. On selected days, cultural practice sessions were also conducted after dinner to prepare cadets for the camp's cultural events.

The camp commenced with the reporting of cadets, registration, accommodation allotment, camp arrangements, documentation, and the selection of Camp Seniors and Company Seniors. It concluded with a grand Closing Ceremony, during which certificates, prizes, and mementos were distributed to deserving cadets and Associate NCC Officers in recognition of their achievements and contributions. Packed lunches were provided before the departure of all cadets. Overall, the ten-day camp successfully fulfilled its objectives by instilling discipline, leadership, self-confidence, physical fitness, teamwork, patriotism, social awareness, and a spirit of service, making ATC–XVII a memorable and enriching experience for every participating cadet.
