### **INTRODUCTION:**

On 24 November 2025, our NCC cadet batch attended the B Certificate Examination, which is considered one of the most important milestones in NCC training. The purpose of this examination was to evaluate the overall capabilities of the cadets, including discipline, theoretical knowledge, leadership qualities, teamwork, and physical fitness. The exam was conducted at a designated NCC camp location, where cadets from various colleges were present. Before the exam date, we received detailed instructions from our ANO and senior cadets regarding preparation, required documents, and uniform guidelines. On the exam day, we reported to the college early in the morning, wearing the NCC uniform with proper belt, shoes, and accessories. All cadets showed enthusiasm and seriousness toward the event. The journey to the exam center was filled with discussions about different NCC topics, including drill commands and exam expectations. For many of us, this was our first experience attending an official NCC certification exam outside our campus, and it created a mix of excitement and nervousness. Overall, the introduction to the examination event was both encouraging and motivating as it marked a major step in our NCC journey.

### **JOURNEY AND REGISTRATION:**

We assembled at the college premises at 6:00 AM, carrying our admit cards, ID proofs, stationary, and water bottles. After a quick uniform inspection, we boarded the bus arranged by the college. During the journey, everyone revised important topics like map reading, first aid, ranks, and weapon safety. Upon reaching the exam center, we were greeted by officers and volunteers who guided us to the registration desks. The cadets were then asked to form queues according to their unit numbers. The registration process was systematic and efficient. We provided our admit cards and signatures, then received our hall numbers and seat allocations. The officers ensured that every cadet followed protocol, maintained discipline, and showed respect while communicating. After registration, we were escorted to a common hall where instructors gave us a short briefing about exam procedures, expectations, and behavior standards. They reminded us that the exam not only tested knowledge, but also discipline, patience, and attitude. We deposited our phones and bags in the storage area and prepared

mentally. The environment was filled with uniformed cadets from different institutions, creating a sense of unity, competition, and motivation for the upcoming examination.

### **WRITTEN AND PRACTICAL EXAMINATION:**

The examination began with the written section. We were given separate question papers covering NCC subjects such as drill basics, national integration, leadership, map reading, weapon handling principles, first aid, disaster management, camp training, and the history of NCC. The questions tested both theoretical understanding and practical reasoning. Time management was crucial, as we had to answer well-structured descriptive and multiple-choice questions within the allotted duration. Many cadets focused carefully to ensure accuracy and clarity. After submitting our written papers, we were taken to the practical exam area. The instructors divided us into groups and asked each group to perform drill movements such as saluting, marching, and basic parade commands. Some cadets demonstrated weapon-handling procedures using training rifles under supervision. A separate panel evaluated physical fitness by assessing stamina, endurance, and coordination. The panel members observed body posture, uniform correctness, voice command clarity, and confidence. Even though the practical tasks were challenging, they helped us understand the importance of discipline and precision in NCC. Throughout the examination, officers encouraged cadets to remain calm and focused. The entire evaluation process reminded us that NCC is not just about theory, but also about real-world application and character development.

### **DISCIPLINE, TEAMWORK, AND PERSONAL EXPERIENCE:**

One of the most impressive aspects of the exam day was the collective discipline shown by all cadets. Everyone behaved responsibly, followed instructions, and helped maintain order. The presence of officers and senior instructors naturally encouraged us to carry ourselves with dignity. We learned that discipline is not only about obeying commands, but also about being punctual, respecting others, and staying organized. Teamwork was evident from the moment we assembled; senior cadets assisted juniors with the uniform, documents, and last-minute doubts. During breaks, we shared snacks, revised together, and encouraged each other to stay confident. In moments of stress, small gestures like reminding a friend to breathe or to double-check an answer made a big difference. At the practical station, some cadets struggled with voice commands, but the group motivated them to speak clearly and stand firm. Personally, I realized the value of preparation and mental stability. Even though I was nervous, I reminded myself that training sessions and drill practices had already prepared me. Observing other cadets from different units gave me a broader perspective on how NCC shapes young students into disciplined leaders. The experience was inspiring, educational, and emotionally rewarding.

The B Certificate examination was a meaningful and enriching experience for all cadets. It tested not only our theoretical knowledge and drill skills, but also our discipline, confidence, and teamwork.
