**Objective:**

The objective of the campaign on cervical cancer for girl students is to create awareness about the causes, symptoms, and prevention of cervical cancer. **Description:**

As per the directions of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India, National Service Scheme (NSS), and in accordance with the guidelines of the Regional Directorate, Hyderabad and Andhra Pradesh State NSS, the NSS Unit-18 of the Biotechnology Department, KL University organized an awareness campaign on Cervical Cancer for girl students on Tuesday, 3rd March 2026, at a high school in Koppuravuru village of Pedakakani Mandal as part of the NSS Special Camp. Dean of Student Affairs, Dr. K.R.S. Prasad, stated that the program was conducted to promote health awareness among students.

Head of the Biotechnology Department, Dr. V. Praveen Kumar, mentioned that cervical cancer is a type of cancer that occurs in the cervix and is mainly caused by the Human Papilloma virus (HPV). He explained that it develops slowly and can be completely prevented if detected early. Students were informed about common symptoms such as abnormal bleeding (between or after periods), pelvic pain, and unusual discharge, and were advised to consult a doctor immediately if such symptoms occur.

NSS Program Coordinator, Dr. P. Srikant Reddy, emphasized the importance of preventive measures such as taking the HPV vaccine, undergoing regular health check-ups like Pap smear tests, maintaining personal hygiene, and adopting a healthy lifestyle. He highlighted that cervical cancer can affect anyone, but early detection and vaccination can significantly reduce the risk.

NSS Program Officer, Dr. M. Sudhamani, encouraged students to be aware of their health, speak openly about any health concerns, seek medical advice without hesitation, and spread awareness among others.

The program was successfully coordinated by NSS Field Coordinator Mr. P. Suresh. The volunteers were appreciated for their efforts by University Vice-Chancellor Dr. G. Parthasarathi Varma, Pro Vice-Chancellors Dr. A.V.S. Prasad, Dr. N. Venkataram, and Dr. K. Rajashekhara Rao, along with Dean Advisors Dr. Habibullah Khan, Registrar Dr. K. Subbarao, Principal Dr. V.
