Objective:

The objective of the Awareness on Pulse Polio Immunization program is to educate people about the importance of polio vaccination for children. It aims to ensure that every child receives the polio drops to prevent lifelong disability. The program also focuses on spreading awareness about immunization schedules and government initiatives. Overall, it helps in eradicating polio and promoting a healthy future for children.

Description:

As per the directions of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India, National Service Scheme (NSS), and in accordance with the guidelines of the Regional Directorate, Hyderabad and Andhra Pradesh State NSS, the NSS Unit–CSE-4 of KL University organized an awareness program on “Pulse Polio Immunization” on Sunday, 15th March 2026, in Veerlapalem village as part of the NSS Special Camp. Dean of Student Affairs, Dr. K.R.S. Prasad, stated that the program aimed to educate people about protecting children from the dangerous disease polio through immunization.

Head of the CSE-4 Department, Dr. T. Pavan Kumar, explained that polio can cause permanent paralysis in children, affecting their ability to walk. Although there is no complete cure for polio, it can be fully prevented through vaccination. He emphasized the importance of administering polio drops to every child under the slogan “Two Drops of Life.” NSS Programme Coordinator, Dr. P. Srikant Reddy, highlighted that all children below five years of age must be given polio drops, even if they are healthy or have previously received vaccinations. He noted that these doses provide additional protection and are available free of cost at nearby Anganwadi centres and health centres.

NSS Programme Officer, Mr. G. Mohana Rao, created awareness about maintaining hygiene practices such as drinking clean water, washing hands, and keeping surroundings clean to prevent diseases. He encouraged parents to take responsibility for their children’s health and ensure immunization, thereby contributing to a polio-free India.

The program was successfully coordinated by NSS Field Coordinator Mr. P. Suresh. The volunteers were appreciated by University Vice-Chancellor Dr. G. Parthasarathi Varma, Pro Vice-Chancellors Dr. A.V.S. Prasad, Dr. N. Venkataram, and Dr. K. Rajashekhara Rao, along with Dean Advisors Dr. Habibullah Khan, Registrar Dr. K. Subbarao, Principal Dr. V. Rajesh, Advisor Dr. Habibullah Khan, Associate Dean Dr. Shanta Sri, and other dignitaries.
