**Objective:**

The objective of the Heat Safety Tips for Farmers in Summer program is to educate farmers about protecting themselves from extreme heat and heat-related illnesses. It aims to create awareness about hydration, proper clothing, rest breaks, and safe working hours during high temperatures. The program also promotes preventive measures to reduce the risk of heatstroke and dehydration. Overall, it supports farmers' health, safety, and productivity during the summer season.

**Description:**

As per the directions of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India, National Service Scheme (NSS), and in accordance with the guidelines of the Regional Directorate, Hyderabad and Andhra Pradesh State NSS, the NSS Unit-11 of the College of Agriculture, KL University organized a "Heat Safety Tips for Farmers in Summer" awareness program on Monday, 30th March 2026, in Pedavadlapudi village. Dean of Student Affairs, Dr. K.R.S. Prasad, stated that the program focused on educating farmers about protecting their health from extreme summer temperatures while carrying out agricultural activities.

Director of the College of Agriculture, Dr. P. Ratna Prasad, explained that prolonged work under intense sunlight can lead to dehydration, fatigue, headaches, heat exhaustion, and even heatstroke. He advised farmers to schedule agricultural work during cooler hours such as early mornings or evenings. He also emphasized the importance of regularly drinking water, buttermilk, coconut water, or ORS to maintain hydration, even when not feeling thirsty.

Head of the College of Agriculture Department, Dr. D. Balakrishna, suggested that farmers protect themselves from heat by wearing caps, turbans, or cloth coverings on their heads, along with light-colored and loose-fitting clothes. He also recommended avoiding fieldwork during peak heat hours between 11 AM and 4 PM whenever possible, and taking breaks in shaded or cool areas. He added that consuming light and nutritious food helps maintain energy levels. NSS Programme Coordinator, Dr. P. Srikant Reddy, advised farmers to immediately stop work and rest in the shade if they experience symptoms such as dizziness, weakness, excessive sweating, vomiting, or faintness. He stressed the importance of drinking water and seeking immediate medical help in severe cases.

NSS Programme Officer, Dr. Vineela, stated that the campaign spread the message, "Health is the Farmer's Strength – Be Careful in the Heat, Stay Safe in Agriculture," emphasizing that protecting farmers' health is essential for achieving productive farming. The program was successfully coordinated by NSS Field

Coordinator Mr. P. Suresh. The volunteers were appreciated by University Vice-Chancellor Dr. G. Parthasarathi Varma, Pro Vice-Chancellors Dr. A.V.S. Prasad, Dr. N. Venkataram, and Dr. K. Rajashekhara Rao, along with Dean Advisors Dr. Habibullah Khan, Registrar Dr. K. Subbarao, Principal Dr. V. Rajesh, Advisor Dr. Habibullah Khan, Associate Dean Dr. Shanta Sri, and other dignitaries.

**Outcome:**

The outcome of the program was positive as farmers gained valuable awareness about heat safety and summer health precautions. They learned practical measures such as proper hydration, safe working hours, protective clothing, and recognizing symptoms of heat-related illnesses. The initiative encouraged safer agricultural practices during extreme weather conditions. Overall, the program helped protect farmers' health and improve their safety and productivity during summer.

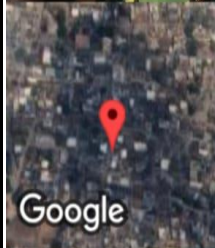
