Objective:

The objective of the Awareness on Vision Problems and Prevention program is to educate people about common eye disorders, their causes, and preventive measures. It encourages regular eye check-ups, proper eye care, and early detection of vision-related issues to avoid serious complications. The program promotes healthy habits such as balanced nutrition, protective eyewear, and limiting harmful screen exposure. It also aims to create awareness that good vision is essential for overall health, education, and quality of life.

Description:

As per the directives of the National Service Scheme (NSS) under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India, and in accordance with the guidelines of the Regional Directorate of Hyderabad and Andhra Pradesh State NSS, the Department of Biotechnology, NSS Unit-18 of KL University, organized a door-to-door awareness campaign on “Vision Problems and Prevention” on Tuesday, 7th April 2026, in Revendrapadu village. Dr. K.R.S. Prasad, Dean of Student Affairs, stated that Biotechnology student volunteers visited households to educate villagers about the importance of eye health and preventive care.

Dr. V. Praveen Kumar, Head of the Biotechnology Department, explained that eyesight is one of the most valuable gifts in human life, but increasing screen time, poor nutrition, pollution, and lack of proper eye care are causing vision-related problems even at a young age. He advised people not to ignore symptoms such as blurred vision, eye pain, headaches, or redness and to seek immediate eye examinations when such signs appear. NSS Program Coordinator Dr. P. Sreekanth Reddy emphasized that maintaining good eye health requires a balanced diet rich in Vitamin A, carrots, leafy vegetables, and fruits. He also advised reducing prolonged exposure to mobile phones, computers, and television screens by giving the eyes regular breaks. Additionally, he recommended the use of sunglasses while outdoors to protect the eyes from harmful sunlight.

He further highlighted that annual eye check-ups are essential for the early detection of conditions such as glaucoma, cataracts, nearsightedness, and farsightedness. Early medical consultation for even minor eye issues can help prevent serious complications and preserve healthy vision. NSS Program Officer Dr. Sudhamani encouraged the public to remember the message, “Let us protect our eyes – Good Vision for a Better Life,” stressing that healthy eyesight is vital for a brighter future. NSS Field Coordinator Mr. P. Suresh successfully coordinated the program and ensured its smooth execution.

The volunteers who participated in this valuable social awareness initiative were appreciated by University Vice Chancellor Dr. G. Parthasarathi Varma,

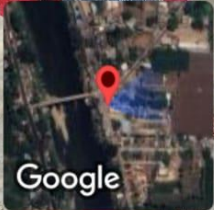
