Objective:

The objective of the “Medicines without Prescription Can Harm Health” awareness program is to educate people about the dangers of self-medication and misuse of medicines. It highlights the health risks caused by taking drugs without proper medical advice, including side effects, wrong treatment, and serious complications. The program encourages individuals to consult qualified doctors before using any medication. It also promotes responsible healthcare practices to protect personal and community well-being.

Description:

As per the directives of the National Service Scheme (NSS) under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India, and in accordance with the guidelines of the Regional Directorate of Hyderabad and Andhra Pradesh State NSS, the Department of Biotechnology, NSS Unit-18 of KL University, organized a door-to-door awareness campaign on “Medicines without Prescription Can Harm Health” on Thursday, 9th April 2026, in Chinakakani village. Dr. K.R.S. Prasad, Dean of Student Affairs, stated that Biotechnology student volunteers visited households to educate villagers about the dangers of self-medication.

Dr. V. Praveen Kumar, Head of the Biotechnology Department, explained that using medicines without a doctor’s prescription can be highly dangerous to health. Many people tend to purchase medicines directly from medical shops for minor illnesses without proper consultation, but this can lead to incorrect treatment, severe side effects, and serious health complications. He warned that misuse of medicines may result in allergies, kidney or liver damage, blood pressure fluctuations, and other harmful conditions.

NSS Program Coordinator Dr. P. Sreekanth Reddy highlighted the particular dangers of taking antibiotics without medical supervision. He explained that improper use of antibiotics can lead to antibiotic resistance, a condition where medicines gradually become ineffective against infections in the future. He also emphasized that a medicine suitable for one person may not be safe or effective for another, as every individual’s health condition is different.

NSS Program Officer Dr. Sudhamani advised the public that for any health issue, individuals should first consult a qualified doctor and only use prescribed medicines in the correct dosage and for the recommended duration. She stressed that health is extremely valuable and that avoiding the habit of self-medication is essential for personal safety and well-being.

NSS Field Coordinator Mr. P. Suresh successfully coordinated the program and ensured its smooth implementation. The volunteers who participated in this important social awareness initiative were appreciated by University Vice

Chancellor Dr. G. Parthasarathi Varma, Pro Vice Chancellors Dr. A.V.S. Prasad, Dr. N. Venkata Ram, and Dr. K. Rajasekhara Rao, along with Dean Advisors Dr. Habibulla Khan, Registrar Dr. K. Subba Rao, Principal Dr. V. Rajesh, Associate Dean Dr. Shanthisri, and other dignitaries for their dedicated service in promoting public health awareness.

Outcome:

The awareness program successfully educated villagers about the serious health risks of using medicines without proper medical prescription. It encouraged people to avoid self-medication and seek qualified medical advice for safe and effective treatment. The campaign increased understanding about the dangers of antibiotic misuse and potential side effects of incorrect medicines. Overall, the event promoted responsible healthcare practices and strengthened community awareness toward protecting public health.

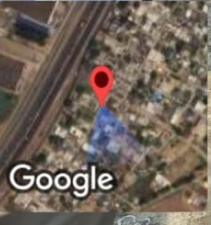

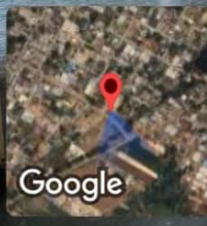
