**Objective:**

The objective of the Campaign on HIV/AIDS Transmission is to create awareness about how HIV is transmitted and how it can be prevented. The campaign aims to educate people about safe practices and correct misconceptions related to HIV/AIDS. It focuses on promoting responsible behavior, including safe sexual practices and the use of sterile needles. Another objective is to reduce stigma and discrimination against people living with HIV/AIDS. The campaign encourages early testing, counseling, and timely medical support. Overall, it seeks to protect public health by empowering individuals with accurate knowledge and awareness.

**Description:**

As per the directions of the Regional Directorate of NSS, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, and State NSS, the NSS unit of KL University College of Pharmacy organized an HIV/AIDS awareness programme on Friday, 12th December 2025, at Vaddeswaram village in Tadepalli Mandal, informed the Dean of Student Affairs, Dr. K. R. S. Prasad. College of Pharmacy Professor and NSS Programme Officer Dr. R. Supriya stated that NSS volunteers visited households and created awareness on how HIV/AIDS spreads, its symptoms, where treatment is available, and how it should be accessed. College of Pharmacy Principal Dr. G. Chakravarthi explained that the use of unhygienic equipment, reuse of needles, shaving multiple persons with the same blade in salons, and getting tattoos without proper sanitization can lead to the transmission of dangerous diseases such as HIV/AIDS, hepatitis, and skin cancers through infected blood.

Dr. R. Supriya further cautioned that such unsafe practices significantly increase health risks. Associate Dean Dr. Shanthisri added that individuals who get tattoos are not only at risk of contracting serious diseases but may also be disqualified from donating blood during emergencies, which can affect their family members. NSS Programme Coordinator P. Srikanth Reddy observed that getting tattoos (permanent body markings) has become a fashion trend across all age groups, especially among youth, and that this practice, if done without awareness and safety, can expose individuals to diseases like AIDS. He emphasized that such risks can be prevented through proper awareness and informed decisions.

The programme was coordinated by NSS Field Coordinator P. Suresh. The volunteers were appreciated by Vice-Chancellor Dr. G. Parthasaradhiparma, Pro Vice-Chancellors Dr. A. V. S. Prasad, Dr. N. Venkataram, and Dr. K. Rajashekar Rao, Dean Advisors Dr. Habibullah Khan, Registrar Dr. K. Subba Rao, Principal Dr. V. Rajesh, and other university officials.

### **Outcomes:**

The HIV/AIDS awareness programme resulted in improved understanding among villagers about the modes of HIV transmission and effective preventive measures. People became aware of the health risks associated with unsafe practices such as reuse of needles, unhygienic shaving tools, and unsafe tattooing. The campaign helped correct common myths and misconceptions related to HIV/AIDS. Participants were informed about the importance of early testing, timely treatment, and accessing proper medical facilities. The programme also promoted responsible behavior and personal hygiene practices within the community. Overall, the event contributed to building a more informed, cautious, and health-conscious society.

### **Impact on Society:**

The HIV/AIDS awareness programme created a positive impact on society by promoting accurate knowledge and reducing fear and stigma associated with the disease. It encouraged individuals to adopt safer health and hygiene practices in their daily lives. The event helped communities understand the serious consequences of unsafe medical and cosmetic procedures. 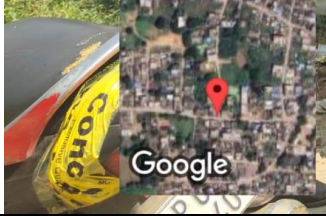
