Objective:

The objective of the Child Marriage Prevention and Women Safety Protection campaign on the occasion of the Special Camp is to create awareness about the harmful effects of child marriage. It aims to educate communities about legal provisions and the rights of children and women. The programme seeks to promote girls' education and delay marriage to ensure their health and well-being. It focuses on empowering women to understand and protect their personal safety. The campaign encourages community responsibility in reporting and preventing violations. Overall, it strives to build a safe, equal, and empowered society.

Description:

As per the guidelines of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, National Service Scheme (NSS), the Regional Directorate, and State NSS, the NSS Unit-12 of the College of Pharmacy, KL University organized an awareness programme on Child Marriage Prevention and Women Safety Protection as part of a Special Camp on Wednesday, 7th January 2026, at Kolanukonda village under the Tadepalli-Mangalagiri Municipal Corporation limits, said Dr. G. Chakravarthi, Principal, College of Pharmacy, KL University. He stated that child marriage is one of the major social evils hindering societal development, and women's safety is a critical concern. With the objective of sensitizing the public, the programme focused on preventing child marriages and strengthening women's safety and protection.

NSS Programme Officer Dr. R. Supriya explained that child marriage disrupts girls' education and leads to serious health and psychological issues. She emphasized that child marriage is a punishable offence under law, and every citizen must take responsibility to prevent it. She clarified that marriage of girls below 18 years and boys below 21 years is illegal. Speaking on women's safety, Dean of Student Affairs Dr. K. R. S. Prasad urged women and girls to report any form of harassment without fear, assuring that the law provides complete protection. He created awareness on issues such as harassment, domestic violence, and sexual abuse, and informed the public about emergency helpline numbers and support services available for women.

NSS Programme Coordinator Mr.P. Srikanth Reddy stressed that women should be empowered through education, self-confidence, and legal awareness. He urged parents to explain the harmful effects of child marriage to their children and to prioritize girls' education. He added that the programme strengthened social responsibility, especially among youth, and conveyed a strong message that everyone must participate in preventing child marriage and ensuring women's safety. He noted that such initiatives promote social change and help build a safe, equal, and inclusive future. NSS Field Coordinator Mr.P. Suresh informed that

volunteers were divided into groups and conducted door-to-door awareness campaigns in the village. He also coordinated the programme. The volunteers were appreciated by Vice-Chancellor Dr. G. Parthasarathi Varma, Pro Vice-Chancellors Dr. A. V. S. Prasad, Dr. N. Venkataram, and Dr. K. Rajashekara Rao, Dean Advisors Dr. Habibullah Khan, Registrar Dr. K. Subbarao, Principal Dr. V. Rajesh, Associate Dean Dr. Shanta Sri, NSS Programme Coordinator P. Srikanth Reddy, and other dignitaries.

Outcome:

The awareness programme helped villagers understand the harmful effects and legal consequences of child marriage. People became aware of the age limits for marriage and the importance of protecting girls' education and health. The programme strengthened awareness about women's safety and available legal protections. Women and girls gained confidence to report harassment and seek help without fear. Door-to-door campaigns ensured wider reach and community participation. Overall, the event promoted social responsibility towards preventing child marriage and ensuring women's safety.

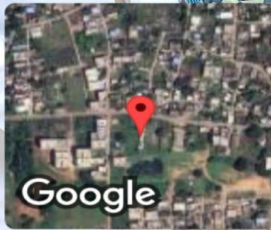
