Objective:

The objective of A Small Gift for Orphans is to spread love, care, and emotional support among orphaned children. It encourages compassion, empathy, and social responsibility among volunteers and society. The activity helps create joyful moments and positive memories for orphaned children. Ultimately, it strives to promote inclusiveness and human values through simple acts of kindness.

Description:

As per the guidelines of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, National Service Scheme (NSS), the Regional Directorate, and State NSS, KL University NSS, in association with the ECE Department, organized a service activity titled “A Small Gift for Orphans” on Thursday, 8th January 2026, at an orphanage in Seetanagaram, said Dr. K. R. S. Prasad, Dean of Student Affairs, KL University. He stated that the programme was conducted with the objective of extending support to orphaned children and contributing to their educational development. Faculty members, students, and alumni of KL University actively participated and provided essential assistance to the children.

Emphasizing that education is a fundamental right of every child, Head of the Department Dr. I. Govardhani and Deputy Head Dr. M. S. G. NSS Field Coordinator P. Suresh stated that volunteers interacted closely with the children and entertained them through games and activities. He also coordinated the
