Event: Training on E-Farming for Farmers & Harmful Effects of Mobile Phones

Date : 18-02-2026

Objective:

The objective of the training on E-Farming for farmers is to enhance their knowledge of modern agricultural technologies and digital tools for better productivity. It aims to educate farmers on using mobile applications, online platforms, and smart techniques to improve crop management and market access. The program also seeks to promote sustainable and efficient farming practices through technology adoption. Additionally, the session on the harmful effects of mobile phones is intended to create awareness about excessive usage and its impact on physical and mental health. It emphasizes responsible and balanced use of mobile devices among individuals. Overall, the initiative aims to empower farmers and students with knowledge while encouraging healthy digital habits.

Description:

As per the guidelines of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, National Service Scheme (NSS), Regional Directorate, and State NSS, the NSS Unit of KL University, in association with the CSE-2 Department, organized a special camp on Wednesday, 18-02-2026. As part of the camp, an E-Farming training program for farmers was conducted to create awareness on how to adopt modern agricultural practices using advanced technologies. Dean of Student Affairs, Dr. K.R.S. Prasad, stated that this training aims to educate farmers on the effective use of digital tools in agriculture.

Head of the CSE-2 Department, Dr. B. Tirupati Reddy, explained that farmers would learn how to use mobile applications to access weather updates, crop management techniques, and information related to fertilizers and pesticides. NSS Program Coordinator, Dr. P. Srikant Reddy, highlighted that farmers would also gain knowledge on selling their produce through online markets without intermediaries, ensuring better prices. He further added that modern techniques such as drip irrigation and precision farming help in reducing water usage while increasing productivity.

In addition, NSS Program Officer, Dr. Ch. Nagamani, spoke about the harmful effects of excessive mobile phone usage. She explained that prolonged screen time can lead to eye strain, headaches, and sleep disorders. It also affects concentration in studies and reduces physical activity, leading to various health issues. Overuse of social media can increase stress, anxiety, and feelings of isolation, while also weakening relationships with family and society. Therefore, she emphasized the importance of using mobile phones in a balanced and responsible manner.

The program was coordinated by NSS Field Coordinator P. Suresh. The volunteers were appreciated by the University Vice Chancellor Dr. G. Parthasaradhi

Varma, Pro Vice Chancellors Dr. A.V.S. Prasad, Dr. N. Venkatram, and Dr. K. Rajasekhar Rao, along with Dean Advisors Dr. Habibulla Khan, Registrar Dr. K. Subba Rao, Principal Dr. V. Rajesh, Associate Dean Dr. Shanti Sri, and other faculty members.

Outcome:

The outcome of the E-Farming training program was highly beneficial as farmers gained practical knowledge about modern agricultural technologies and digital tools. They became aware of using mobile applications for weather updates, crop management, and accessing information on fertilizers and pesticides. Farmers also understood the advantages of online marketing platforms to sell their produce directly and earn better profits. The session on harmful effects of mobile phones helped participants recognize the importance of limiting screen time and adopting healthy digital habits. Students and villagers developed awareness about physical, mental, and social impacts of excessive mobile usage.
