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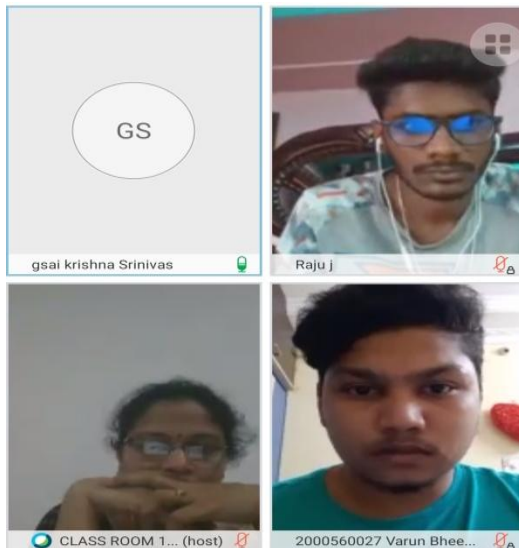

Event started with a welcome note by Dr.I.Govardhani Associate Dean (Grievances, Cells, and Committees) and she introduced the Resource person Smt. K.Rajani Priya, Estate Manager, Presidential Secretariat, Rastrapati Bhavan, Government of India. She delivered interesting points on various aspects of Gender diversity. The main points of her speech are covered by a slide show Gender diversity is equitable or fair



representation of people of different genders. It most commonly refers to an equitable ratio of men and women, for many of us, college is our first brush with reality.
