

Report on a Five-Day FDP on Effective Usage of KL ERP and KL LMS

• **Participation**: 30 faculty members from KL University Vijayawada Campus participated in the training program.

Overview: The Academic Staff College of KL University organized a five-day Faculty Development Program (FDP) on "Effective Usage of KL ERP and KL LMS" from January 3, 2023, to January 7, 2023. The FDP was aimed at training faculty members on the effective use of KL ERP and KL LMS for teaching, learning, and research and enhance the proficiency of faculty members in utilizing KL University's Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) and Learning Management System (LMS). Dr. Uday Kiran and Dr. M. V Naresh, esteemed resource persons with expertise in the field, conducted the program.

Objectives: The primary objectives of the FDP were as follows:

1. To familiarize faculty members with the functionalities and features of KL ERP and KL LMS.

Program Highlights:

Day 1: Introduction to KL ERP and KL LMS

On the fourth day of the FDP, the participants discussed the challenges and opportunities of using KL ERP and KL LMS in the classroom. They also shared their best practices with each other.



Day 5: Integrating KL ERP and KL LMS

- Streamlining academic and administrative processes.
- Case studies and best practices.
- Q&A and interactive discussions.

On the fifth and final day of the FDP, the participants presented their queries on LMA and ERP usage for both offline and online courses to the resource persons and received feedback.

Conclusion: The "Effective Usage of KL ERP and KL LMS" FDP conducted by the Academic Staff College of KL University was a resounding success. It equipped faculty members with the skills and knowledge necessary to leverage these essential tools for academic and administrative
