### **OBJECTIVES**

The objectives of organizing a Health Camp on Blood Grouping and Hemoglobin Test are to promote public health awareness and facilitate early detection of potential medical issues. By offering free blood grouping services, the camp aims to educate individuals about their blood types, which can be critical for medical emergencies. Simultaneously, conducting hemoglobin tests helps identify anemia and other blood-related disorders, allowing for timely intervention and improved overall health outcomes. A hemoglobin test measures the amount of hemoglobin in your blood. Hemoglobin is aprotein in your red blood cells that carries oxygen to your body's organs and tissues and transports carbon dioxide from your organs and tissues back to your lungs.

If a hemoglobin test reveals that your hemoglobin level is lower than normal, it means you have a low red blood cell count (anemia). Anemia can have many different causes, including vitamin deficiencies, bleeding and chronic diseases.

The normal range for hemoglobin is:

- For men, 13.5 to 17.5 grams per deciliter
- For women, 12.0 to 15.5 grams per deciliter

### **OUTCOMES**

Organizing a Health Camp on Blood Grouping and Hemoglobin Test yields several positive outcomes. Firstly, it enables individuals to gain valuable insights into their health, including their blood type and hemoglobin levels, promoting awareness and informed decision-making. Early detection of anemia and other blood-related disorders allows for timely medical intervention, potentially preventing more serious health issues.
